Reflections: John 1:29-34



"A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me."

These words of John the Baptist seem like a riddle, Jesus was born after John but is older and ranks ahead of John. In human experience this doesn't make sense. We live by birth order. The older child or the oldest person comes first.

What seems like a simple riddle in reality announces a radical reordering of human existence. Jesus is clearly human and known to John's audience to have been born after John, so John's words mean that Jesus existed before Jesus was born. How is this possible? Jesus is both human and divine. John is revealing that Jesus is the Son of God.

John is also hinting at the radical message that Jesus brings to human existence. The disruption of birth order implied when John says that Jesus "ranks ahead of me..." can be understood on two levels. We willingly rank Jesus ahead of ourselves as the Son of God. On another level Jesus' ministry will make clear that it is not priority of birth that matters but a new understanding of equality and service. We are all created equal in God's image and we are called to serve one another as equals.

Reflection: In Ordinary Time, we contemplate things that are far from ordinary—things like the existence of God, the person of Jesus, and being made in God's image. Who in my life has witnessed to the greatness of God?
