

## Reflections: Living the Paschal Mystery

Our perspective on life, on what matters to us, on what drives our

decisions is revealed to us in many ways. We need only to look at our possessions, preoccupations, what motivates us. When we become caught up in serving our social status or image, our acquisition of things, our professional success, even our own self-righteousness, we afflict ourselves with anxieties such priorities always engender. When we choose to serve God—make God the Master-center of our lives—we enter a realm of internal freedom and wealth beyond calculation.

The gospel invites us to turn our attention to what truly matters—the Life only God can give. What is Jesus telling us must be our first concern in life? While being attentive to having the food and clothing, etc. that is normal and necessary, our priority must be what God offers and only God can give: eternal care, eternal Life.
