

Reflections: Matthew 4:1-11



The story of Adam and Eve is the eternal question of good and evil. Adam and Eve personify each person who strives to have all the power and possessions. When we collaborate with evil, evil ends up destroying us.

Though sin abounds, Jesus offers life, forgiveness, and redemption. Where Adam fails, Jesus, the "new Adam," is the obedient son of God. At his baptism, Jesus was totally submissive to God's will. He overcame evil by having faith and trust in God's care despite the obstacles in his path. During Lent, each of us has the opportunity to be like Jesus. When the Elect come forward to declare their desire to be baptized in Christ, we make our own commitment to renounce the works of evil and strive to do God's will. God confirms our intention: "You are my beloved son; you are my beloved daughter."

Reflection: Am I aware of the Spirit's guidance through the desert places in my life? How has the Spirit helped me to overcome temptations on my Lenten journey?

Decision making by Consensus – Means all members of the council need to voice their views and opinions. Everyone has to speak. No dumb ideas. Every thing adds to the discussion. Decisions are made with prayerful discernment, a merging of insights and consensus. These decisions have to do with long term planning and the spiritual direction of the parish. Most decisions are made as part of a process rather than a hard vote. This process usually takes a

Who

A person of prayer, committed to our faith community and willing to share thoughts, ideas and observations in order to build a vibrant parish family. The Council fosters a climate of teamwork and operates using a consensus model.

Who is eligible to become a council member?

- •Has been baptized or received into the Roman Catholic Church.
- •By his/her free and consistent choice is a registered member of Our Lady of Mercy Parish.
- •Contributes to the betterment of the parish

Am I right for the Job?

All nominees are led through a discernment process to determine if they are being called to serve on the council at this time. There is an informational

If you bring with you a desire to learn, everything you need to know in order to create a vision and goals is provided. The council studies together any important documents or areas of church life as needed to form policy.



Taize prayer is a style of prayer from a small community of monks in France that is known and revered throughout the world.

The service consists of short chant-like melodies, sung over and over in a meditative environment with candles and religious icons, plus some short scripture readings and moments of silence for meditation.
