

FAITH FORMATION

REFLECTION FOR THE WEEK JOHN 20:1-9



Today we gather in joy. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad." Our day-long celebration nears its end as we reflect on all that we have seen and heard in this shortest of seasons, the Easter Triduum. We must not lose sigh of the reason we have come together: death and life have been locked together in a unique struggle from the first moments of creation to Christ's victory over death. We too have contended with "things above" and "things below." We cannot celebrate this feast with the "old yeast" of corruption but with the "unleavened bread" of truth.

Today we gather with the disciples, filled with confusion and doubt. We want to believe that the risen Lord is among us, but we do not recognize him when he walks alongside us. We share our concerns with one another, but often we have no answers. That is when we must go side-by-side to gaze into the empty caverns of our lives and try to understand it together. Then, slowly, hesitantly, we begin to see and believe. Like the disciples of Emmaus, we who eat and drink with the risen Lord can testify to his presence in our midst, "The Lord has risen indeed!" Now we must go forth and share our joy with those who have not gathered us.

Questions about Divorce

Can I still receive Communion?

- ⇒ Divorced and not remarried? Yes, you may receive communion.
- ⇒ Divorced and remarried? You are still a member of the church but are asked to refrain from receiving communion until you go through the healing process of an annulment.
- ⇒ Further guidance concerning the reception of the sacraments after divorce can be sought from a parish priest.
- ⇒ (It should be noted that a Catholic who has divorced and remarried is not excommunicated.)

Does an annulment mean my marriage

did not exist?

- ⇒ Civil law and Church law explain marriage differently. Civilly the marriage did exist. Children are not illegitimate.
- ⇒ According to Church teaching marriage is more than a legal agreement. It is a covenantal bond that ideally happens only once. Hence the Church recognizes that sometimes this bond never truly formed. Through a healing process of annulment the church formally recognizes this so the person is free to marry again within the church.
