



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

John 6:51-58 (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ)



God's love was offered to the people on their journey through the desert.

Hungry and thirsty, Moses fed them with the "manna" that God provided (Ex 16:2, 15). Jesus also fed the hungry people in the wilderness with miraculous loaves. The bread he gave them was only a foretaste of the true bread that comes from God. The Israelites ate the mamma in the desert, but they all died. Jesus is the life-giving bread who eternally sustains those who believe in him. Jesus spoke clearly of the nourishment of his body and blood: his flesh is 'real food' and his blood is "real drink." Jesus is the supreme "sacrament" of God, nourishing the faithful with his own body and blood on their spiritual journey. All who eat the bread of life and share the cup of salvation have communion with him and with those gathered at the table. We must remember and be grateful for all God's benefits.

For Reflection: Do I remember that we are all one in Christ's Body? Am I mindful of all the hungry and thirsty people of the world?

5K Chicken Run & Chicken Little Run


