

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



Matthew 21:28-32

It is easy to blame others for our problems. "It's not fair!" we complain. Sometimes we even blame God: "The Lord's way is not fair." But God challenges us, "Is it my way that is unfair, or are not your ways unfair?"

Paul urged the community to stop their quarreling and be united in spirit. The love and compassion they showed one another would make his joy complete. Paul could think of no better example to follow than Christ, who emptied himself of his glory and became a servant to all. Because Jesus suffered the humiliation of the cross, God exalted him, giving him the name above all names: Jesus Christ is Lord!

Jesus' own life and death showed the importance of obedience to God's ways. Jesus told his followers a story of a man who had two sons. The father asked the elder son to go work in his vineyard. "I'm on my way, sir," he said. But he never went. Then the father asked the younger son the same thing. The boy refused but later regretted his behavior and went to work, even though he didn't want to do it. Jesus asked, "Which of these sons did what the father wanted?" We would probably say, "neither one." Jesus said that actions speak louder than words. Repentant sinners were getting into the kingdom of God before the self righteous who only gave lip service.

For Reflection: Am I obedient to God's will even when it is hard? Do I blame God and others for my problems, or do I take personal responsibility?

A multi-denominational campaign is underway across Erie County to boost church attendance. The campaign titled "Take Me To Worship" was developed by Unified Erie's Religiosity Committee whose research indicates that weekly participation in religious services helps reduce violence, drug and alcohol use and the incidence of suicide. Thirty-six Catholic parishes in Erie County are participating in this initiative through October 30.

Over the next several weeks we'll share the committee's findings:

Window of Opportunity: Of youth surveyed for the 2014 Erie County Youth Religiosity Survey, 14% said that they never participate in religion, but they used to. The majority of these youth said they stopped attending between the ages of 9 and 14, with a significant number leaving between the ages of 10 and 12. That means efforts to engage both parents of youth and youth themselves need to exist within that window of opportunity.



Father Patrick J. McCormick of Cross Catholic Outreach will be visiting our parish next weekend to speak at all the Masses on behalf of the poor in developing countries. Cross Catholic Outreach was founded to create a meaningful link between parishes in America and the priests and nuns working in the Church overseas in the Caribbean, Africa, Asia, Central and South America. Father McCormick, born and raised in Erie, PA, was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Atlanta in 1968. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1990 as an active duty chaplain and served around the world before joining Cross Catholic in 2013.


