

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



Matthew 22:15-21

It is God who calls us by name and arms us with gifts. It is God who grasps us by the hand and empowers us when we are weak. It is God who closes the gates of tyranny and oppression. The reign of earthly monarchs is limited by the borders of their kingdoms. They must submit themselves to the One who rules the universe: "I am the Lord and there is no other."

Paul knew that he belonged to God and that everything he did depended on God. His preaching the gospel was not a matter of mere words: the Holy Spirit gave him the conviction that moved hearts to hear and accept God's word.

Jesus was sent by God to lead the people to God's kingdom of truth and justice. While legitimate governments had their rights, God's power surpassed human sovereignty. "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's," he told his followers. Taxes? Obedience? Loyalty? "Yes," Jesus said, and then he reminded them to " give to God what rightfully belongs to God."

God invites us to be citizens of two worlds: an earthly and heavenly kingdom. God has given us responsibilities in each domain. God does not expect us to assume this extraordinary task on our own. The call and the grace come from God. By laboring in love, we continue to prove our faith and show constancy in our hope in Jesus Christ.
