

### **THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION**

Matthew 25:1-13

"Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out."



Wouldn't it be great if we could compete in a marathon by borrowing the necessary strength, skill speed and endurance from a world-class runner? What if we could get slimmer and smarter by having other people diet and study for us? We could let someone else do all the training, and we could cash in on his or her hard work and preparation.

Obviously, there are some things we cannot borrow from others. We cannot borrow another person's intelligence, artistry, integrity, or character, to name a few. We may benefit from these qualities in other people, but we cannot make them our own by simply wishing it so.

In Today's gospel all ten virgins were waiting for the bridegroom, but only five had thoughtfully and carefully prepared to meet him. The five foolish virgins wanted to meet the groom, but their preparations were not sufficient, and they could not borrow preparedness from the five wise.

We are called to prepare today, tomorrow, and every day to meet the Lord, so that we will not hear those terrible words, "I do not know you." We all want to meet the Lord with our lamps burning, but are we properly prepared?

For Reflection: What am I doing to prepare myself to meet the Lord in each and every day?

#### Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ,



On the weekend of November 18-19, parishes in our Diocese will be taking up a special collection for the "Catholic Campaign for Human Development" (CCHD). In the United States, more than 46 million people are living in poverty. The CCHD is an anti-poverty program to help them find hope and a way to a more secure life. Support offered through this collection reaches those living on the margins and gives them a hand up, not a hand out.

For example, around Charleston, South Carolina, many children live in poverty, creating undue stress and uncertainty in their lives. Compounding these problems, deteriorating school systems struggle to provide quality education and appropriate discipline, and there is a high rate of school-based arrests. By engaging congregations and communities all over the city, the Charleston Area Justice Ministry is working to improve the education system, and keep kids in school and out of the juvenile justice system. With your support of the CCHD Collection, the Charleston Area Justice Ministry is able to provide community engagement to reduce youth arrests and violence.

Each year, nearly half of the funds raised in our diocese from this collection remain here in the Diocese of Erie to fund local anti-poverty projects. We have been able to use our Diocesan share of this collection to provide children and adults with food, clothing, shelter, medical assistance and counseling.

Your support of this collection makes a difference for people living in poverty across the United States. Please prayerfully consider how you are able to help the CCHD this year. Thank you in advance for your generosity.


