THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



Mark 13:33-37

When we face misfortunes in our lives, we sometimes blame God for our troubles: "You are our Father - why did you allow us to wander from your

ways?" The problem is not God's faithfulness. It is our infidelity to God, who longs to guide us as a shepherd leads his flock. "Lord, let us turn to you. Show us your face and we shall be saved."

Paul is a faithful witness to God's loving-kindness. In gratitude, he thanks God for the favors bestowed on us. He prays that we will recognize that we are the work of God's hands. When we do, the work of our hands will be as beautiful.

Jesus compares himself to a master who has gone on a journey and left his servants in charge of the household. They are warned to be constantly vigilant, keeping watch at the gate of the house he built. If we stay awake, we will be ready to greet him when he comes again.

For Reflection: Am I keeping careful watch over my household? Am I using God's gifts to advance God's reign.
