Waiting for good news or bad

news can fill us with joy or dread. One day may seen like a thousand years. When we forget God's faithfulness, we need to be assured that God's promises will be fulfilled, perhaps not by our watches and calendars but with guaranteed fidelity. We need to comfort others and when they fail to remember: "Here is your God! See, the Lord comes with might to save us!"

John announces the good news: "Make straight the way of the Lord!" John is God's mighty voice, yet Jesus' words are more powerful. John stresses judgement, whereas Jesus speaks of salvation: "Kindness and truth shall meet; justice and peace shall kiss." The mountains in our lives will be overcome; the wastelands will flourish in the grace of the Holy Spirit. God is a loving shepherd who shows generous patience toward us when we wander. We need to patiently wait in hope as we pray: "Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation!"

For Reflection: Am I making every effort to be found without "stain or defilement" as I await Christ's coming? Do I work for justice and peace in my community?
