

EXPERIENCE THE SACRAMENTS...



Jesus spent the greatest amount of his time healing, both spiritually and physically. It is said that we spend our time on those things which are most important to us. If this is true, then healing must have been a very important value to Jesus.

Our Parish Mission Statement reminds us that we are a community that lives the values of Jesus Christ. Our celebration is not just for the sick. The faith

community gathers with them to show their concern for the sick of our community, and to pray with and for the sick of the community.

The celebration of this sacrament is an opportunity for the deepening of the faith of our entire community by witnessing the faith and devotion of those being anointed. Through anointing, the sick are reminded that Christ and the Church are in communion with their suffering.

Our Parish Community will celebrate this powerful sacrament at all Masses on November 18 & 19.

Who may celebrate this Sacrament? Those who are suffering any serious physical or mental illness; those who are suffering any chronic illness. those who are about to undergo surgery; the elderly who cannot get around as well as before.



Advent is a beautiful season to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. While not officially described as a penitential season (which distinguishes it from Lent), Advent is still a season for ongoing conversion, as we reflect on the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus and heed John the Baptist's call to repentance and conversion.

Communal celebrations of the sacrament of reconciliation remind us that continued conversion is a journey we make together as the Body of Christ.

Fr. Ritchie answers Your Faith Box Questions

Why do we not keep the 4th Commandment?

I wish I knew why we don't keep the 4th Commandment - "Honor your father and mother", but I don't. The question does remind us that honoring parents is not just for children but for adults also. As we age, honoring our parents is not about obeying them, but respecting them and being there for them, taking care of their needs. We are called to respect people at all ages.

Living in a "ME" centered society where everything is about the individual makes it more difficult for us to focus on others and to show others the respect that God calls us to give to all people.

Keeping the 4th Commandment creates an environment for greater understanding and kindness toward one another, teaches us to treat others as we would like to be treated, (the Golden Rule), and teaches us to, as Jesus asks us, "love one another as I have loved you".

Why do certain things happen the way they do?

We may not know why certain things happen, only God knows. What we do know is that life usually goes in directions we least expect, that people don't always act the way we would hope they would act, that bad things do happen to good people.

We are called to be open, to have the faith that God will give us the strength to get through tough times, that God will challenge us and that we are called to trust that whatever comes will make us a better person.

We trust that our experiences will afford us an opportunity to share our gifts with others. With our kindness, compassion, and presence we will not only help others, but grow in our knowledge and perspective.
