THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



John 1:35-42

If we listen carefully, we can hear the voice of the Lord speaking to us. God speaks in the sacred space where we worship as well as in the holy temple within us. Sometimes we fail to hear God's voice because we haven't listened deeply enough. At other times the profane voice drowns out the divine voice. Then we must wait in silence and say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." When we listen well, we can declare: "Here I am, Lord; I come to do you will."

John the Baptist heard God speak, and it drove him to do strange and wonderful things that seemed foolish to some. Why invite people to repent and then immerse themselves in the muddy waters of the Jordon? But John listened to God's voice instead of the voices of protest. John not only listened; he looked. As Jesus walked by, John wanted others to see what he saw. "Look! There is the Lamb of God!" Despite our blindness, Jesus sees us. "What are you looking for?" He invites us to come and see for ourselves. It will take a lifetime of listening, seeing, and following the one who calls us.

For Reflection: Do I take time to listen to God's voice? What is God telling me? How will I respond?

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In his 2017 World Communications Day Message, Pope Francis takes an unblinking look at how information is impacting our culture. While acknowledging that a constant focus on bad news contributes to anxiety and fear, he knows we cannot ignore the challenges of our times.

Yet he still finds room for hope.

"I would like to contribute to the search for an open and creative style of communication that never seeks to glamorize evil, but instead to concentrate on solutions and to inspire a positive and responsible approach on the part of its recipients," he writes. "I ask everyone to offer the people of our time storylines that are at heart 'good news.""

That is exactly what we try to do in the Diocese of Erie. Overseeing our efforts to evangelize, to teach, to empower and to minister to those in need – not to mention the logistics of interacting with 97 parishes, 43 schools and dozens of ministries and agencies spread out across 10,000 square miles –requires that we share an enormous amount of information. I am committed to transparency, and work closely with our Communications Office to make sure we use every avenue possible to keep you informed.

But it's about more than information. We prioritize inspiration as well. As Faith magazine begins its 13th year of publication, it's clear there will never be any shortage of stories about people in our diocese who are living out the Gospel with creativity and generosity. This year, we also are preparing to launch an updated website, designed to be welcoming, engaging and user friendly. And I have been enjoying reaching out to you with my new Twitter account in recent months.

Each of these efforts is important to our lifelong journey as disciples. That's why I'm asking you to please support the Help Spread the Faith collection January 27-28.
