## This Sunday's Reflection



#### John 3:14-21

We are a displaced people, alienated from God by sin. The songs of joy we once sang are silent; our music is still. Searching our memories, we recall God's fidelity, sending messengers over and over to warn us of our sin. When there was no remedy to heal our wounds, God delivered us up to our own depravity. Yet God is rich in mercy. Because of God's great love for us, we are brought to life when we were dead in sin. With Christ we are raised up to heavenly places.

Jesus reminds us that it is due to God's love that the world was saved. Moses gave us a glimpse of what this means. In their desert wanderings, the people were bitten by venomous snakes, and they cried out to be saved. God told Moses to mount a bronze replica of the serpent on a staff and hold it up for all to see. All who looked at the instrument of affliction were healed. When we can look at Jesus on the cross, we know that we are saved through his suffering and death. We have a choice. We can turn toward the darkness of sin or turn toward the light of Christ's love. There is healing in that wonderful light.

For Reflection: Am I an instrument of God's love? What healing do I need so that I can bring healing to others?
