THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



Luke 24:35-48

In season and out, we must continue to allow Christ to transform us. God's mercy toward Peter gives us courage to believe that our sins can be wiped away too. When we repent of our faults and failures like Peter did, we will have a resurrection story to share with others.

On their journey home to Emmaus, two disciples shared their dreams, which were dashed to pieces at Calvary. They had hoped that Jesus was the one who would liberate them and their nation. Because their eyes were fixed on their own ambitions, they could not see that Jesus was present to them. When they heard him recount the story of salvation, they were able to recognize him at the table. Then they could tell a new story: "The Lord has risen! It is true!"

In the midst of the community, Jesus confronts our doubts and fears with a message of peace. In word and sacrament, and in a repentant, faith-filled community, we know that the risen Christ is among us. Because we are changed, the whole world can be transformed.

For Reflection: Have I been true to Christ's words? How does the Christian community help me to recognize Christ in the Eucharistic community?

Care for God's Creation

"The earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more like an immense pile of filth." - *Laudato Sí 21*, *Pope Francis*.

"Currently about 300 million tons of plastic are produced each year to make bags, bottles, packages, and other commodities for people all over the world. Unfortunately, only about ten percent of this plastic is properly recycled and reused. The rest ends up as waste in land-fills or as litter in our natural environment, where it leaches dangerous chemicals into the nearby soil and water, endangering humans and wildlife alike." - *Earth Day Network website*.

Consider how you and your family can move away from a throwaway culture. **Say NO** to disposable plastic whenever and wherever possible. Choose items that are not packaged in plastic, and carry your own bags, containers and utensils. Say, "no straw, please." **Reuse** durable, non-toxic straws, utensils, to-go containers, bottles, bags, and other everyday items. Choose glass, paper, stainless steel, wood, ceramic and bamboo over plastic.

Catholic Social Justice Tradition recognizes two types of necessary responses to God's love called the "Two Feet of Love in Action": social justice and charitable works. We walk with the Social Justice foot when we work to foster peace and justice and work for long-term change in local and global communities. We step with the Charitable Works foot when we work to aid or assist others both locally and globally to meet their immediate, short-term needs.

Did I miss the Ministry Sign up in January?

No – we did not have a ministry sign up in January. We are moving the ministry sign up to the fall. In October, we will have a ministry ceremony at Mass, asking people to recommit to their ministries, join a new ministry or indicate that they wish to retire.

Why was there no Ministry Sign up In January?

The Stewardship Committee wanted to look at a more efficient way to track the people involved in ministries. Ninety-five percent of the parish simply signed up for the same ministries year after year. For the 10 to 15 people who made a change or joined a new ministry we were handling 300 papers and making mistakes in the process.

What do I do if I want to sign up for a new ministry?

You may sign up during the month that we celebrated the ministry (see chart below) or wait until October during the ministry commitment weekend. If you would like to join a new ministry sooner, then please contact Donna Clark in the parish office.

What do I do if I want to retire from a ministry?

Simply contact the person who coordinates that particular ministry and tell them you wish to retire. If you do not know who that person is, please contact Donna Clark in the parish office.
