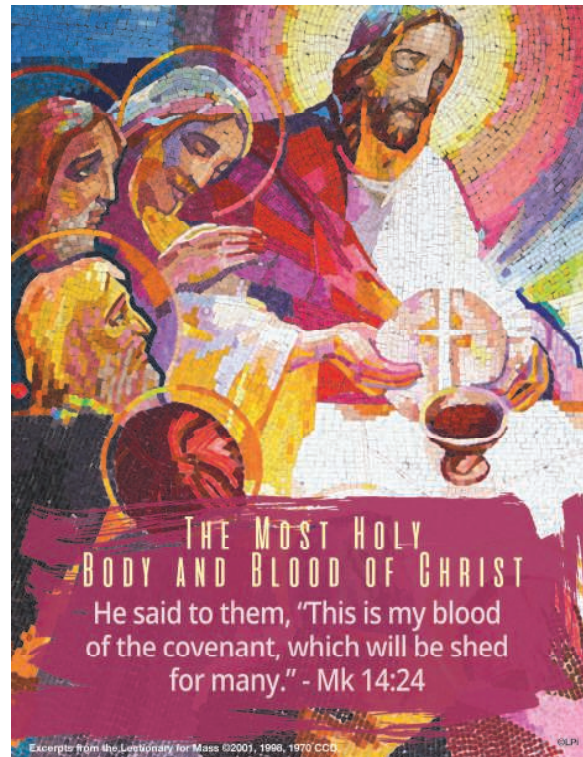

## CHILD PROTECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS

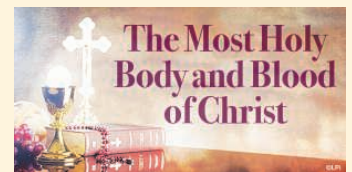


### **Listen to your children:**

This summer, when your children are out of school and on different schedules, meeting new people and going to new places, make sure that you talk to them often about their experiences and the people they've met. Listen carefully to your children. If possible, observe and get to know the other children and adults who are part of your children's summertime fun. Above all, communicate your safety concerns to your children. Make sure they know that they can come to you with any concerns they may have about the people they interact with. And if you hear of or observe behaviors that may be inappropriate, make sure to communicate your feelings to people who are in a position to intervene. Communications is key to creating and maintaining a safe environment all year round. ## THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

**Matthew 14:12-16,22-26**



Our human hunger and thirst underlie our spiritual hunger and thirst. We who are the Body of Christ encounter Christ in bread and wine: "Take and eat. This is my body. Take and drink. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many." When we take the bread in our hands and the cup to our lips, it is not just in his memory; it is a living contract with Jesus Christ in faith and love. We answer; "all that the Lord has said, we will heed and do!" How can we do otherwise?

But we forget; we fail to keep our word. We need to remember that Jesus offered himself as the mediator of a new covenant of God's kingdom of peace and justice. The acceptance of the old covenant was entirely dependent on Israel keeping the law. When the law was broken, the covenant was broken, and Israel's relationship with God was broken. But Jesus said, "This is a new covenant and it is not dependent on law but on love." At the table of the Lord, the mystery is hidden yet revealed. We become the Body and Blood of Christ, food and drink offered to a hungry and thirsty people.

## Women's Summer Study

Once again, we will have a Monday evening gathering for women in the parish. Gather at the home of Irene (1019 Bartlett Rd.) at 7:00 p.m. June 18, 25, July 9 & 16. Weather permitting, we will meet on the patio. Extra lawn chairs may be appreciated. We will discuss the teachings of 4 distinguished female saints. Of the thousands of canonized saints in the Catholic Church, only 35 have been named "Doctors of the Church", recognized as exemplar teachers of the faith. Of these 35 Doctors of the Church, only 4 are women, all receiving that title in the last 50 years. Unlike their male counterparts, these women did not have the opportunity to study at the finest universities of their day, did not hold Church office or even have access to great libraries. Yet their faith, prayer and cooperation with the Holy Spirit overcame all restrictions for women of their day enabling them to emerge as extraordinary, if accidental theologians, whose words continue to instruct and inspire. Over 4 weeks we will look at the lives and teachings of St. Hildegard of Bingen, St. Catherine of Siena, St. Teresa of Avila and St. Therese of Lisieux. What might these holy and creative women have to teach holy and creative women of our day?
