

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

Solemnity of The Nativity of St. John the Baptist

Only three nativity festivals occur on our Western liturgical calendar—that of Jesus, Mary, and John the Baptist. We know nothing, really, of Mary's birth, but Scripture records events surrounding John's birth, events in no small degree as miraculous and similar as those of Jesus himself: Gabriel visited Zechariah like Gabriel visit Mary; the Archangel names both John and Jesus; John is born of elderly, barren parents and Jesus is born of a virgin; the people asked of John, "What, then will this child be?" and all who heard the shepherd's account of Jesus' birth were amazed; Zechariah prays the *Benedictus* and Mary prays the *Magnificat*.

John "grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the desert until the day of his manifestation to Israel." His call was to be the precursor of Jesus the Christ. St. Augustine even interpreted the day of celebrating his birth, June 24, as significant of his vocation. This is the beginning of summer; just a few days ago we had the day of longest light in the year. Now the days begin to grow shorter, symbolic of John's own declaration of his relation to Jesus: "He must increase, I must decrease." Jesus himself is born at the time of the longest darkness for he is the Light of the world. John preaches repentance, announces that the Light of the world is coming, prepares the way for the Messiah. Most importantly, John baptizes Jesus who is then announced as the beloved Son.

"What, then will this child be?" Prophet. Humble precursor. Baptizer. Martyr. Saint. In this John the Baptist eloquently shows us the way through life's deserts to be in loving relationship with Christ.

Once again, we will have a Monday evening gathering for women in the parish. Gather at the home of Irene (1019 Bartlett Rd.) at 7:00 p.m. June 25 and July 9 & 16. Weather permitting, we will meet on the patio. Extra lawn chairs appreciated. We will discuss the teachings of 4 distinguished female saints. Of the thousands of canonized saints in the Catholic Church, only 35 have been named "Doctors of the Church", recognized as exemplar teachers of the faith. Of these 35 Doctors of the Church, only 4 are women, all receiving that title in the last 50 years. Unlike their male counterparts, these women did not have the opportunity to study at the finest universities of their day, did not hold Church office or even have access to great libraries. Yet their faith, prayer and cooperation with the Holy Spirit overcame all restrictions for women of their day enabling them to emerge as extraordinary. We will look at the lives and teachings of St. Hildegard of Bingen, St. Catherine of Siena, St. Teresa of Avila and St. Therese of Lisieux. What might these holy and creative women have to teach holy and creative women of our day?


First Eucharist Pictures
