

THIS SUNDAY'S

REFLECTION

Mark 5:21-43



Throughout the ages, God's people have struggled with the problem of suffering. With the psalmist we ask: "What profit is there in my death? Will the dust praise you? Will it tell of your faithfulness?" There are no simple solutions, but there is hope: God did not make death. God made all things that they might have life. Yet what happens when those dearest to us suffer and die? Do we come to the Lord hopeful yet fearful as we plead for the life of a loved one? Do we come to the Lord feeling unworthy and unclean, desperately reaching out to receive healing and peace? Jesus knows our needs and our longing to be restored to wholeness and life. "Fear is useless! What is needed is trust," he tells one. "Your faith has healed you!" he says to another. Together we praise God for rescuing us from distress and drawing us from the pit of despair. When our suffering is united to Christ, the forces of darkness and evil are defeated.

For Reflection: Do I need Courage to come to Jesus for healing? For whom do I need to intercede today?

This teaching guides us to be a people of peace. From the U. S. Catholic Bishops Conference: "The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching also calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding increasingly effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person."

Dangers of Cell Phone Cameras

Cell phone cameras are a mixed blessing. Forget your camera? Whip out the cell phone, and your toddler's first step, friend's goofy mishap, or fenderbender is captured for posterity. But cell phones are also being used in a sinister way - to silently take pictures of unsuspecting children, adolescents, and adults n compromising positions and without their consent. Plus, digital photos can be placed on the internet very quickly - within minutes of taking the photo - and distributed around the world. In fact, some web sites have been created for the sole purpose of posting photos taken surreptitiously with camera phones. Be aware of anyone using a cell phone in an awkward way, such as not holding it up to his or her ear or facing his or her mouth in a walkie-talkie style. Be especially cognizant of any suspicious cell phone use in areas where people could be in various stages of undress or where children are gathered. If you see someone using a cell phone in a way that appears suspicious, don't be afraid to ask what he or she is doing or to alert someone in a position of authority about your concerns.
