



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

John 6:41-51

The prophet Elijah fled for his life from the vindictive queen. He quickly forgot the wonders he saw



on Mount Carmel, where the false prophets lost their contest with God. Elijah was ready to give up. "This is enough!" he complained to God, "Take my life." Instead of death, Elijah received the bread of angels. Strengthened for his journey, the prophet was able to walk 40 days and 40 nights to God's mountain, Horeb. The psalmist extolled God's mercy: "O taste and see that the Lord is good!"

Sometimes, we forget to praise God's goodness. Like the people in the desert, we fail to be grateful for God's good gifts. We look at bread and wine but do not recognize Christ in our midst. God's gift of Jesus is extraordinary. All who partake of him are filled with the everlasting. To refuse to participate in this gift is to miss life and to die. As sons and daughters of God, we are asked to follow Jesus's way of love by offering ourselves to God, who feeds us with the life-giving bread that comes down from heaven.

For Reflection: Am I a sign of Christ's presence in my community? What does it mean to live in love, as Christ loved us?

Parishioners, employees encouraged to be cautious sharing personal information

Parishioners at an Erie parish recently received an email from a scam artist claiming to be their pastor and requesting financial help. To keep everyone safe from fraud, parishes are asked to include the following notice



in their weekly bulletins and forward it to employees and volunteers: In this age when personal data can be misused by scam artists, please be aware that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie, clergy and entities such as parishes and schools will never solicit your personal or business information by any method unless initiated by you. Should you receive an unsolicited request for such information—including a request for gift cards of any type—exercise extreme caution. Contact the person or entity by using official contact information only. Do not use contact information provided in the potential fraudulent request.

CHURCH IN LATIN AMERICA COLLECTION

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Latin America is home to millions of faithful Catholics. However, due to circumstances of distance, terrain, political instability and lack of resources, it is often very difficult for the people to practice their faith. In fact, in some rural areas of Mexico, priests and catechists are only able to visit the villages twice a year. Many of these communities lack books and religious materials, while others do not even have a church or education center.

The annual collection for the Church in Latin America (CLA) allows us to help. For example, thousands of people living in the Amazon jungle of Ecuador can grow in their Catholic Faith through materials now published in their native language. The CLA collection has helped to produce and distribute prayer and catechetical books. It has helped to fund Catholic radio programs which are now broadcast over a wide territory. Your contributions in previous years have made a real difference in sharing our Catholic faith with others.

Today I ask you to renew your support for our brothers and sisters in Latin America. I invite you to pray for them, and to support this year's **collection for the Church in Latin America**, which will be taken up on the weekend of August 18-19. Together we can make a concrete difference in the lives of our fellow Catholics throughout Central and South America. Please know my gratitude for your generosity. Be assured of my prayers.
