



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

John 6:60-69

Before they crossed over into the Promised Land, Joshua gathered all the people and challenged them



to make a decision. Would they serve the gods of the world or the true God of Israel? Fidelity to God is not easy. We must think carefully before taking on such an obligation. We must decide not only today but tomorrow and the next day. We hope that we will say, as Joshua did: "As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD" (24:15). But can I decide for others when my own faith commitment may be fragile? Can I make such a commitment for my loved ones—spouses who do not believe, children who are disinterested? We must not impost our faith on others but rather defer to one another, waiting patiently for the Spirit to stir each heart to make a decision.

Jesus knows how weak our human flesh is. He knows we sometimes fail to take his words seriously. We murmur in protest at his words, even though we know the promise they contain: "The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life" (Jn 6:63). Jesus knows there are some among us who do not believe. "Do you want to leave me too?" he asks. "To whom can we go?' we cry. "You have the words of eternal life" (v 68b).

For Reflection: Have I pledged my faithful commitment to the Lord today?



Gr. K-2 Sunday Morning RE Ministry will begin the year with a Parent/Child event.

After that, children will meet their teachers and go to class while parents will remain in Sperry Hall for a Parent Meeting. Siblings are welcome to share in this event.
