

Mark 10:2-16

God created us to be partners of one another. Superiority and dominance have no place between women and men; the two are one body. This image indicates the number of drug-related deaths for 2016 and 2017 In Erie County, PA. According to a report this week the County Coroner states that the 2018 Year-to-Date drug related deaths number 66.



The exact reason(s) for the slowing rate of deaths is not known for certain. But one theory is that the

increasing availability of Naloxone (Narcan) to first responders and even family members of addicted people has allowed for effective intervention and lifesaving reversal of the effects of opioids.

The public standing order that allows a family member to obtain Naloxone is kept on file at many pharmacies.



Code of Conduct

The Diocese of Erie is committed to protecting the children and youth who are entrusted to its care and to ensuring that those in ministry with our young people are in right relationship with the children/youth receiving services. To share in the ministry of Christ is a great privilege as well as tremendous responsibility. The *privilege* is the joy of sharing in the mission of Jesus Himself. The *responsibility* is acting in a way that conforms to the attitude and actions of Christ. Autumn Scripture Study


