
Our Parish Mission Statement reminds us that we are a community that lives the values of Jesus Christ. Our celebration is not just for the sick. The faith

community gathers with them to show their concern for the sick of our community, and to pray with and for the sick of the community.

The celebration of this sacrament is an opportunity for the deepening of the faith of our entire community by witnessing the faith and devotion of those being anointed. Through anointing, the sick are reminded that Christ and the Church are in communion with their suffering.

Our Parish Community will celebrate this powerful sacrament at all Masses on November 17 & 18

Who may celebrate this Sacrament? Those who are suffering any serious physical or mental illness; those who are suffering any chronic illness. those who are about to undergo surgery; the elderly who cannot get around as well as before.



Advent is a beautiful season to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. While not officially described as a penitential season (which distinguishes it from Lent), Advent is still a season for ongoing conversion, as we reflect on the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus and heed John the Baptist's call to repentance and conversion.

Communal celebrations of the Sacrament of Reconciliation remind us that continued conversion is a journey we make together as the Body of Christ.

THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

The Church has a long tradition of remembering those who have died during the month of November. At Our Lady of Mercy, we have the custom of giving a place of honor to the book in which community members and visitors write the names of their beloved dead.

The **Book of Remembrance** provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief. Our parish Book of Remembrance is displayed in the sanctuary from the Solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of Advent. It is left open for people to

write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls. Remembering all of these men and women who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith," helps us better understand and appreciate our faith in the Christ our risen Lord who conquers sin and death and brings new life to all.

OREMUS A Catholic Study on Prayer

We know we should pray. We want to pray. But often we don't know how to start or where to go. Our prayer is empty. Distractions and life's demands pull us away from prayer. So, we pray half-heartedly, sporadically, tiredly. Oremus is an eight-week study for those who want to pray better, both those who are not sure they know how to pray and those who have been praying for many years and want to deepen or enrich that life of prayer. Learn new ways to pray, how to hear God when you pray, how to handle times of struggle in prayer and more.

This is an 8-week program. Each week will include a video presentation and facilitated conversation on one aspect of prayer.

A workbook is available for \$15, but it is not necessary to purchase the workbook to participate.
