

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION LUKE 6:39-45



Many gardeners practice crop rotation. Where this year's peas grew, next year's carrots are planted. Last year's lettuce is replaced by beets. Families with young helpers can find more surprising results. The frothy leaves of a young carrot crop up between the smooth, rounded sides of an eggplant. A neatly space row of radishes is broken by a single pepper plant. Try as it might the misplaced vegetable cannot hide what it is, and no gardener will misidentify a plant simply because of its location.

Today's gospel teaches the same lesson about God's garden of growing Christians. "Every tree is known by its fruit. People do not pick figs from thorn bushes... or grapes from brambles." When God looks at the fruit of our lives, he sees the truth, no matter what row we've planted ourselves in. If we are the lone onion in a petunia patch, it shows, and vice versa. Jesus' words are a call to each Christian, reminding us to dig deep into the rich soil of the gospel, watering our roots with prayer, that we might bear good fruit and be known by it.
