ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This value of Jesus that deals with physical healing is called the *sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick*. As a community we celebrate this sacrament at all Masses on the weekend of March 16th and 17th.

Who may celebrate this sacrament? Those who are suffering any serious physical or mental illness; those who are suffering any chronic illness. those who are about to undergo surgery; the elderly who cannot get around as well as before.

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION LUKE 4:1-13



Israel commemorated their deliverance from slavery with a thanksgiving feast. In the same way, our Eucharistic meal of thanksgiving celebrates our redemption from the bondage of sin. In gratitude for divine mercy, we bring our offerings before the altar. Paul reminds us how expansive God's mercy is: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Like Jesus, we must confess our faith when we are faced with the temptation to turn away from God. We need to ask ourselves, which kingdom do we serve? Do we worship before the throne of earthly power or before the altar of the Lord? Do we find satisfaction in the things of the world or in God's life-giving word? What we confess with our lips must be believed in our hearts. As the Elect come forward to express their readiness to join the community of the faithful, we reaffirm our intention to do God's will. Then God will hear our cry and stretch out his hand to save us. With the psalmist we pray, "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust."

For reflection: Do I have the courage to profess my faith to others? Do my actions show what I believe in my heart?

For more than 2 decades, Dr. Villella has been traveling to Central America to provide free eye care to some of the world's poorest patients. With hospitals in Guatemala, Mexico, Haiti, Nicaragua and Peru, Vision For the Poor treats around 300,000 patients each year. Operated and staffed by indigenous doctors, the 8 hospitals run by this organization are largely selfsupporting for operating costs. Dr. Villella will share the story of his call to "give sight to the blind".

On Feb 4th we collected 160 cans of soup and received \$70.00 in cash for the support of the food pantry from 4 area churches.



Thank you all. We continue to serve about 325 people each month. Our clients are very grateful for the food. Also we thank Katrina DeVore who recommended us for a \$5,000 grant from the UPS Foundation, which we received in January. We again received \$5,000 from the Moose Club as well. If you know a member of the Moose Club, please thank them. These funds will allow us to purchase 4 to 5 months' worth of food from Second Harvest and Shurfine when our grants run out. When our federal, state and local grants run out, we spend between 1,500 and 4.000 on food from Second Harvest.

Operated and staffed by indigenous doctors, the 8 hospitals run by this organization are largely self-supporting for operating costs.

Dr. Douglas Villella has been the Executive Director of Vision for the Poor since 1995. In addition to serving as staff eye doctor for Community Health Net and Health South Rehab, he has been in private practice with Bayfront Eyecare since 1987. Born in Punxsutawney, he graduated from St. Bonaventure Univ and Pennsylvania College of Optometry. He served as captain in the U.S. Army before moving to Erie.
