





## THIS SUNDAY'S **REFLECTION**



**LUKE 9:28-36** 

Abraham is an example for all who put their faith and hopes in the Lord despite evidence to the contrary. Abraham and his wife were childless and advanced in years, yet God promised that their descendants would be as "numerous as the stars of the sky." God demands nothing of Abraham but trust. "The Lord is my light and my salvation," the psalmist declares as he waits with courage.

From the darkness of prison Paul writes to encourage the faithful: "Be imitators of me." No matter what the outcome, Paul has faith that his mortal body will be transformed by Christ's own death and resurrection.

As Jesus faces the dark night of the cross, he is transfigured in the light of God's glory. Before the eyes of Peter, John, and James, Jesus speaks with Moses and Elijah of his own "exodus" from death to life. When the vision passes, Peter wants to stay on the mountaintop to celebrate the event. The divine presence overshadows them and a voice declares, "This is my son, my chosen one. Listen to him!" There is no camping on the mountain. They must keep their eyes on Jesus and go forth to do his will in the world.

For reflection: Do I listen to what God is telling me? Do I see God's plan for me in the midst of trials?


#### **Grief Support**




The journey through grief can be unpredictable. Just when things start to feel settled an event or word will bring on a wave of tears and sadness. This is normal. The ups and downs are easier to

#### **Food Pantry News**

On Feb 4<sup>th</sup> we collected 160 cans of soup and received \$70.00 in cash for the support of the food pantry from 4 area churches.



Thank you all. We continue to serve about 325 people each month. Our clients are very grateful for the food. Also we thank Katrina DeVore who recommended us for a \$5,000 grant from the UPS Foundation, which we received in January. We again received \$5,000 from the Moose Club as well. If you know a member of the Moose Club, please thank them. These funds will allow us to purchase 4 to 5 months' worth of food from Second Harvest and Shurfine when our grants run out. When our federal, state and local grants run out, we spend between \$1,500 and \$4.000 on food from Second Harvest.

# ST. PATRICK'S DAY FUN FACTS

#### St. Patrick wasn't Irish.

St. Patrick wasn't Irish, and he wasn't born in Ireland. Patrick's parents were Roman citizens living in modern-day England, or more precisely in Scotland or Wales (scholars cannot agree on which). He was born in 385 AD. By that time, most Romans were Christians and the Christian religion was spreading rapidly across Europe.

#### St. Patrick was a slave.

At the age of 16, Patrick had the misfortune of being kidnapped by Irish raiders who took him away and sold him as a slave. He spent several years in Ireland herding sheep and learning about the people there. At the age of 22, he managed to escape. He made his way to a monastery in England where he spent 12 years growing closer to God.

#### St. Patrick used the shamrock to preach about the trinity.

Many claim the shamrock represents faith, hope, and love, or any number of other things but it was actually used by Patrick to teach the mystery of the Holy Trinity, and how three things, the Father, The Son, and the Holy Spirit could be separate entities, yet one in the same. Obviously, the pagan rulers of Ireland found Patrick to be convincing because they quickly converted to Christianity.

#### Patrick's color is blue.

The original color associated with St. Patrick is blue, not green as commonly believed. In several artworks depicting the saint, he is shown wearing blue vestments. King Henry VIII used the Irish harp in gold on a blue flag to represent the country. Since that time, and possibly before, blue has been a popular color to represent the country on flags, coats-of-arms, and even sports jerseys. Green was associated with the country later, presumably because of the greenness of the countryside, which is so because Ireland receives plentiful rainfall. Today, the country is also referred to as the "Emerald Isle."

#### Legend says St. Patrick drove all the snakes from Ireland.

According to legend, St. Patrick drove all the snakes, or in some translations, "toads," out of Ireland. In reality, this probably did not occur, as there is no evidence that snakes have ever existed in Ireland, the climate being too cool for them to thrive. Despite that, scholars suggest that the term "snakes" may be figurative and refer to pagan religious beliefs and practices rather than reptiles or amphibians.

#### March 17th is when Patrick died.

Saint Patrick is a saint of the Catholic Church, and his holy day is the day of his death, and subsequent entrance to heaven, rather than the day of his physical birth. After spending most of his adult life converting the pagans of Ireland to Christianity, St. Patrick went to his reward on March 17, 461 AD.
