



**THIS SUNDAY'S** REFLECTION LUKE 13:1-9

With the elect preparing for baptism, we take a careful look at how we are progressing in our own faith. Like Moses, we discover God's presence in the ordinary circumstances in our lives. No matter how common, the place where we stand is holy ground. God calls us each by name, at the same time disclosing the divine name: "I AM." God is the God of the present, eternally tending to all our needs here and now.

"The Lord is kind and merciful," the psalmist rejoices in the surpassing compassion of God, who secures justice for the oppressed. Paul reflects on the events throughout sacred history and says that they are examples to encourage us and help us to live in faith and trust.

When we suffer adversity in our lives, Jesus tells us that God is not punishing us. Tragic events happen to people, not because we are the worst of sinners but to wake us up to our own mortality. Jesus gives us a sober warning lest we become presumptuous of God's mercy. God is patient, giving us ample time to change our ways. But if we refuse to reform our lives, like the fruitless fig tree, there will be a time when God's forbearance will come to an end.

For reflection: Have I taken time to scrutinize my life? Have I found a holy place that helps me to be holy?

Shane Mathew, a professor in the Dept of Theology at Gannon Univ and native of Erie. Fr. Mathew was ordained in 2005. 
#### Final Call: Register Today for the 2019 Catholic Women's Conference!
