



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LUKE 22:14-23:56

God gave the prophet Isaiah a "welltrained tongue" to rouse the people from their lethargy. Because the

prophet first listened to God, he earned

the right to speak to the people. Although the price for speaking God's words was often persecution, the prophet did not rebel. Yet, even thought we trust in God to rescue us, in the darkness of suffering we cry out with the psalmist, "O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest." Paul tells us that our attitude must be that of Christ who, in his passion, willingly united himself to our frail human nature and accepted even death on a cross.

That is what Eucharist is all about—ioining ourselves with Christ's dying and rising, emptying ourselves of all control and power over others, and trusting in God's desire to save us from everything that disfigures our humanity. At the table with Christ we are all one: no one is greater than anyone else; each one serves the other. Because Christ has strengthened us in his Body and Blood, we can say with Peter, "Lord, at your side I am prepared to face death itself!"

We don't always succeed in our good intentions. We look for the sword and the crown to overcome our adversaries. It is then that we must listen to Jesus's words, "Forgive them; they do not know what they are doing," and have faith in his promise that one day we will be with him in paradise. Gratefully we proclaim God's loving-kindness and commend our hearts and lives into the merciful hands of God who loves us.

For Reflection: How do I deal with suffering and defeat? Do I look forward to rising with Christ?

Journeying Through Grief




The three N's of grief are that it is Grief normal, natural and necessary. Sometime people feel the need to apologize for becoming emotional when talking about
