

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



JOHN 20:1-9

Today we gather and joyfully sing: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad." Yet we must not lose sight of the fact that death and life have been "locked together in a unique struggle" from the first moments of creation to its climax in Christ's victory over death. We too have been engaged in a contest between the "things above" and the "things below." Often we were like Mary Magdalene, filled with confusion and doubt. We want to believe that the risen Lord is among us, but we do not know where to find him. Peter and John are uncertain too and have no answers for us. That is when we must go together to gaze into the dark, empty caverns of our lives and try to understand together. Slowly, hesitantly, we begin to see and believe. Then, like Peter, we are able to witness to the Christ-event in our lives, "He was dead, but God raised him up."

As we leave this celebration, we walk with the disciples of Emmaus on that long and lonely road of life. "Stay with us Lord," we plead. And he does. We who ate and drank of the Lord's Body and Blood can testify to his presence in our midst. Now we must go forth and share our joy with those who did not gather with us this day.

For Reflection: Can other people see that Christ is alive in my life?





Social Justice News

Child Abuse Prevention Month Be Vigilant.

It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children. And we must always communicate our concerns to the appropriate parties. Sometimes this means communicating our safety concerns to our children. And sometimes this means communicating our concerns about seemingly inappropriate behavior to those who are in a position to intervene. Parents must also listen carefully to their children and observe both their children's activities and the behavior of older children and adults who interact with them. When children exhibit dramatic behavioral changes, adults must find out what caused the changes. Being aware of what's happening with our children means talking to, listening to, and observing them - at every opportunity. It is most appropriate that Child Abuse Prevention Month is held during the Easter season. There is no better time than Easter to celebrate the protection of our most valuable gift from God – our children. Pastoral Council Planning

- Greeters and Fr Ritchie welcoming people
- Welcome others who sit around me in church.
- Engage in conversation before and after liturgy

Belonging:

- Inviting others to join OLM for Mass or other events
- Good follow-up when joining a new ministry
- Ministry leaders work conscientiously to make sure new members are included.
- Participating in parish events helps with a sense of belonging
- Discover Your Strengths workshops or experimenting with joining new ministries
- Talking to people to help them feel like they belong.
- Current ministry members welcoming and encouraging new members
- OLM does a good job of advertising in the bulletin & announcements at the end of mass.
- Received written invitations to join ministries
- Letting new ministry members know the expectations
- Sending thank you notes to ministry members and festival workers
- Quilt on back wall of worship space
- Baptism at Masses engages the community
