


The Question-of-the-Week Winner for the week of April 28 was **Alivia Smith, Gr. 6**, who knew that the Easter Season ends on Pentecost.

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



JOHN 21:1-19

The psalmist wrote, "Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning! "Peter and the apostles knew the dark night of fear and dread. They also experienced the glorious light of the Spirit in the face of suffering and persecution. Filled with the Spirit, they boldly proclaimed the name of Jesus and his message of repentance and forgiveness of sin.

John of Patmos could have been in a pit of despair, yet he was encircled by countless voices that proclaimed, "Worthy is the Lamb who is slain! " For a Christian, death is not defeat but victory. All who believe share in Christ's power and wealth, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and praise. With all of creation we cry, "Amen! "

Without Jesus' physical presence, the disciples were discouraged. "I'm going fishing! " Peter declared. "We'll join you," the others answered. But in the fog-shrouded night, they couldn't catch a thing. Then at daybreak they heard a familiar voice calling, "Children, cast your nets to the other side." Their obedient faith brought forth a tremendous haul of fish. In the breaking of the bread, they recognized the risen Lord in their midst. Like them, we are to be Christ's presence by feeding and caring for his flock.

For Reflection: Who has been a light-bearer to me when I am in darkness? Do my actions help others to see the way?

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments Prevalence of Child Sexual Abuse

Child sexual abuse is a great deal more prevalent than many imagine. Some studies suggest that as many as one in six boys and one in four girls will be the victim of some form of sexual molestation before the age of 18. That means that, directly or indirectly, child sexual abuse will touch most of us during our lifetime. And although we would like to believe that most accusations are false, the facts tell us that children rarely lie about being molested. In fact, they rarely tell anyone at all. An adult study about the prevalence of sexual abuse found that 42% of the men and 33% of the women who were victimized as children had never told anyone. 
Thank you for your continued support of the food pantry ministry. It does make a difference.
