

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION JOHN 17:20-26



Before Jesus died, he prayed for his faithful followers and for all who would believe in him through their testimony. The Spirit would dwell within their hearts to strengthen and guide them. But there was a cost involved in proclaiming the reign of God. Many closed their eyes and ears to the truth. Others used force to silence them. As Stephen stood against hostile powers, a vision of the glorified Christ bolstered his courage and enabled him to die like his Lord, forgiving those who killed him. Stephen's death had an impact on one person who witnessed it. Saul, who later became the great apostle Paul, also died a martyr by laying down his life in testimony to his faith in Christ.

John understood the cost of following Christ too. Exiled for bearing witness to Christ, he also experienced a vision of the exalted Christ - the Alpha and Omega, the First and Last, the Beginning and the End, the Root and Offspring of David, the Morning Star shinning bright! The Spirit and the Bride of Christ say, "Come! " All who have given their lives for the sake of God's reign cry, "Amen! " as they are welcomed into the kingdom and drink the life-giving water.

For Reflection: Do I proclaim the truth and justice of God's right? Have I experienced hardships as a result of this?


Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments Listen to your children

Meditation on the Holy Spirit

he will guide you into all the truth.

Day 3 – The Need to be Born of the Spirit

Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit.

Day 4 – The Spirit Give Life to Dry Bones

Thus says the Lord God to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. Acts 1:8 / John 16:13 / John 3:5

Day 5 – Life through His Spirit

If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you,

he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you. Romans 8:11

Day 6 - Understanding Comes through the Spirit

Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that if from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. 1 Corinthians 2:12

Day 7 - One Spirit, Many Gifts

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit: and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord: and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone.

1 Corinthians 12:4-6

Day 8 – The Fruit of the Spirit

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control.

There is no law against such things.

Day 9 – The Outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost

Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and begin to speak in other languages,

as the Spirit gave them ability. Acts 2:3-4
