



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION Luke 12:13-21



What is to be gained when laborers toil in the heat, with worry and anxiety gripping their hearts and minds? What profit is there for landowners who work with knowledge and skill if, when they die, their property is left to others who have done nothing to deserve it?

For answers to such questions, we must lift our vision above this world and its trials. We have been raised with Christ in baptism; therefore, we must put to death our worldly thoughts and put on the life of Christ. Material goods are illusory and do not guarantee the happiness we seek. Jesus illustrates this in a story of a rich man who had a good harvest but did not have enough bins to store all his grain. If he built larger ones, he could relax and enjoy life for years to come. But before he could finish the job, his life was taken. Who would inherit his wealth? Who would benefit from his labors? We too must ask ourselves hard questions. Are we rich in the eyes of the world, or in the sight of God?

For Reflection: How does my life in Christ affect the way I live? How will it affect the way I die?

Bringing the Gifts of the Community to the Altar

Bringing the gifts of bread and wine to the altar defines who we are as a Eucharistic People. Reminiscent of a time when people brought bread and wine from their own homes to the Eucharist celebration, this



procession of our gifts (mostly money now) still retains its force and spiritual significance. Along with the bread and wine, it is an offering "for the relief of the needs of the Church and of the poor. . . . It is a symbolic expression of the gathered assembly's participation in the Eucharist and in the social mission of the Church." (The Mystery of Faith, Lawrence J. Johnson, p.62) Say yes the next time you are asked to represent the community's generosity and love for God. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children. CARE FOR CREATION

Catholic Social Teaching, Part 2

LAUDATO SI
4TH ANNIVERSARY
2019

As was stated in Part 1, "Catholic Social Teaching is the body of Church doctrine that describes how Catholics are called to transform the world by proclaiming and living the Gospel". Several parts of that teaching directly relate to our Care for Creation. Today we consider the Option for the Poor and Vulnerable.

"A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring." The effects of climate change disproportionately harm poor and vulnerable people. People who are living in poverty don't have the resources needed to recover from a devastating hurricane, or the resources needed to build new irrigation systems as rainfall patterns change. This is particularly unjust because, on a global scale the poor are often least responsible for contributing to the causes of climate change. To live the Catholic value of caring for poor and vulnerable people, we must address climate change.

Celebrate Laudato Si! Go outside!
We live in a living world! Take your shoes off and walk on the grass. Take a deep breath. Look at the sky. Watch the flight of a bird. Listen to bird songs. Smell a flower. Admire a tree. Feel the warmth of the sun or gaze in awe of the stars. For at least 10 minutes do nothing but experience and delight in the goodness and richness of creation and give thanks to God. Praise Be-Laudato Si'!

Turn your yards into pollinator gardens. Pollinators (bees, butterflies, beetles, flies) are necessary for three-quarters of our major food crops, and they are in trouble due to exposure to parasites and pesticides, and loss of floral abundance and diversity due to increased land-use. We can help pollinators by creating garden areas specifically designed to attract and feed them.
