



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

Luke 12:49-53

The reward of the prophet who serves God is often hardship and trials. Jeremiah stood up to the people in power, but it was a thankless task. He was left to die in the miry well for speaking God's truth. Like Jeremiah, we know that life can be hard, yet we wait in hope for God to save us. With him we pray, "Though I am afflicted and poor, the Lord is my help and my deliverer."

Jesus warns us that the peaceable kingdom he comes to establish will meet with opposition. Even households will be divided in their loyalty to him. Jesus comes to set the world on fire, not with warfare and destruction but with the light of faith. In our dying and rising in baptism, the fire ignited on Calvary is set ablaze.

We are members of a great household of faith, surrounded by a cloud of witnesses who show us how to endure the crosses of life and bear them with joy. Abraham, Jeremiah, Paul, and Mary help us to persevere in the contests of life. We will reach our goal if we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who inspires and perfects our faith. Despite opposition, we will not give up but will keep running the race until we cross the finish line.

For Reflection: When have I felt afflicted like Jeremiah for speaking the truth? Who are the prophets, martyrs, and saints that inspire me not to give up?

Social Justice

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops states "The Catholic Church in the United States is an immigrant Church with a long history of embracing diverse newcomers and providing assistance and pastoral care to immigrants, migrants, refugees, and people on the move... In Christ, the human race is one before God, equal in dignity and rights."

The USCCB references scripture before providing three principles to guide the policy making on immigration. The scriptures include:

- •Lv. 19:33-34. You shall treat the alien who resides with you no differently than the natives born among you; have the same love for him as for yourself; for you too were once aliens in the land of Egypt.
- Mt 25:35. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me.
- •Gal 3:28. There is neither Jew nor Greek . . . for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

Three Principles espoused by the USCCB:

- People have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families.
- •A country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration.
- •A country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy.

The Ignatian Examen - A Form of Prayer

The Daily Examen of
Consciousness is not to be
confused with the traditional
Examination of Conscience. This
is not a disciplined designed to
heighten awareness of moral
failings. Rather, it is a spiritual
exercise, which encourages greater
sensitivity to God's action in the
ordinary moments of life. This
sensitivity helps us to recognize
how God is calling us to grow in
holiness, how we can respond with
greater fidelity to the prompting of
the Holy Spirit.

The daily *Examen* is prayer. It is very important that one is conscious of being at prayer. This is prayer, an opening up to grace.

Set aside approximately 15 minutes. Most people pray it only once a day, in the evening but one can also use this prayer at midday.

Find a relatively quiet place where distractions and interruptions are minimal. Assume a comfortable, but attentive, posture.

Step #1 Pray to the Holy Spirit

Begin this time of prayer by quieting your heart and mind so that you can be aware of God's presence with you. Ask the Holy Spirit for the gift of holy light as you review your day.

Step #2 Be Grateful For the Signs of God's Love

Review your day with particular attention for the numerous signs of God's love it held for you. Because you are a physical and relational creature, God will communicate that love in physical and relational ways. E.g. in the beauty of a sunrise, the song of birds, the silence of new snow, in the praise of a colleague, the giggle of a grandchild, the request of a stranger, in the warmth of the furnace, the flavor of a bowl of

soup, the refreshment of sleep, in all the little things of the day.

Be Grateful for the Ways you Were a Sign of God's Love

Be aware of the ways that you were a blessing for others: the booboos you kissed, the time spent listening to another, the meal you served, the ride you offered, the silence support you gave. Praise God for the times you could incarnate Divine love. Never take for granted the honor of being able to show love.

Step #3 Review Your Day for Your Response to God

This step is the longest and most grace-filled segment of the *Examen*. Like viewing a movie, watch the events of your day. Be attentive to the ways that you responded to God's love in your life throughout this day. Although your words and actions are important, notice your emotional responses, your motivations, your patterns of behaviors as well. Positive responses to God's love are just as significant as negative ones.

Ignatius believed that emotions were critical means for God's self-communication and could tell a person a great deal about their spiritual life. Where were you feeling angry or anxious, excited or enthusiastic, calm or cautious, frustrated or fearful, peaceful or proud, etc.? What was the source of those emotional reactions? Did your anger come from a wounded pride or protective care for a loved one; was it exacerbated because of physical pain or an unresolved and unrelated prior hurt?

Notice your motivations. Do you assist a colleague because you want her to succeed or because you want to gain commendation from your supervisor? Notice

instinctive or automatic reactions. Do you normally assume malevolent or charitable reasons for the words and deeds of another? Notice patterns. Do the coffee breaks at the office regularly deteriorate into complaint or gossip sessions? Notice growth. Were you able to have a conversation with the cause of a past hurt without the bile rising in your throat? Were you able to be more patient with an annoying in-law?

Step #4 Talk With Jesus

Imagine Jesus, the lover of your soul, your best friend, your guide and confident, sitting with you. Talk with Him about your reactions, motivations and actions of the day. Ask Him to guide you through all that you have noticed in the day, to guide you to a life of faithfully following the Gospel. Spend time listening to what Jesus has to say.

Step #5 Anticipate the Grace of Tomorrow

Because the *Examen* is a prayer that invites you to a more faithful walk with Jesus, anticipate the grace you will need for a holier life tomorrow. Allow the strongest feelings or insights of this day to lead you to ask for the grace you will most need. If your reflection revealed unresolved hurts, pray for forgiveness. If your reflection showed you the face of someone you ignored, pray for the grace to see and reverence that one. If it confronted you with an area of stress or frustration, pray for the courage to make the necessary changes.

Also, be aware of your obligations for the coming day. What emotions do you experience as you note all that lies ahead of you? Pray for the specific grace that you will need for each item on your calendar.
