



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION LUKE 14:25-33

follow the Lord.



Even if we had the wisdom of Solomon, we could not fully understand what God intends. If we cannot comprehend the things of earth, the things of heaven are beyond our grasp. Yet with God's Spirit, the path to knowledge can be made straight as we learn to

Jesus's lessons on discipleship are not easy. One moment he teaches loving concern for others, and then he tells us to turn our backs on everyone else. Jesus's instructions are not mutually exclusive. Being his disciples means that we are not attached to anything that stands in the way of following him. God's reign must have first place in our hearts.

Following Jesus exacts a price. Paul learned to value those things that really mattered through suffering and hardship. As a prisoner for the Lord, he interceded for others who were in chains. Paul appealed on behalf of a runaway slave, asking his master to receive him back as a "beloved brother." If we are daunted by the high demands of Jesus, we must remember that we are not left on our own to fulfill them. Worldly wisdom may tell us otherwise, but we have the wisdom of the Spirit to guide us every step of the way.

For Reflection: What lesson have I learned today as a disciple of Christ? Do I teach this by the way I live my life?

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Globally, malnutrition causes forty-five percent of all preventable child deaths. Of those who survive, one in four suffer from physical and cognitive stunting. As Catholics, we are called to care for our neighbor in need – including our neighbors around the world. What would it take to realize God's vision for a world in which everyone has enough? In the last 10 years, stunting has been reduced by one-third through improved access to nutritious foods, vitamins and minerals, clean water and sanitation, and promotion of breastfeeding.
