





# THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION





The people of Israel were once slaves in Egypt, and it took them a long time to learn how to live in freedom. As they wandered in the desert, they often took the wrong path. They sacrificed to the idols instead of worshiping the God who liberated them. Moses did not deny the reality of the sin, yet he interceded on the sinner's behalf.

Paul did not rationalize his sins; rather he humbly accounted himself the worst sinner: blasphemer, persecutor, arrogant unbeliever. Because he experienced God's forgiveness, Paul was an example to all who came afterward.

In the parable of God's mercy, the two sons are mirrors of us all. Though we are children of a benevolent father, we often regard ourselves more like slaves than sons and daughters. When God's rewards seem distant, we are tempted to squander our eternal inheritance as the younger son did. Like the elder son, we are angry when our father takes our brother back and reinstates him. Neither one fully understands the radical love of God: "Everything I have is yours, for you are with me always." When we repent our sins, God tells us, "Though you were once dead, you have come back to life."

<u>For Reflection</u>: Am I grateful for God's mercy when I sin? Do I show God's forgiveness to others?

Globally, malnutrition causes forty-five percent of all preventable child deaths. Of those who survive, one in four suffer from physical and cognitive stunting. In the last 10 years, stunting has been reduced by one-third through improved access to nutritious foods, vitamins and minerals, clean water and sanitation, and promotion of breastfeeding. 
