



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

LK 17:5-10

"Increase your faith!" we cry when we see violence and injustice and when God seems indifferent to our appeals. "If today we could hear your voice," we please. Like the prophet Habakkuk, we want a message from God as large as a billboard. They prophet said: "God will not disappoint you. If there is a delay, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not be late."

Paul is a model of the faithful disciple. Persecuted and imprisoned, he wrote with courageous hope and optimism. "Be strong! Be loving! Be wise!" he exhorted. "Stir into a flame the gift of faith God gives you!" Paul teaches us that we are God's servants, not God's masters. We cannot command God to act according to our timetables. Paul reminds us that we have a rich deposit of faith. We can draw from it when we forget that God is faithful and will fulfill what is promised.

For Reflection: How do I respond when things don't go according to my schedule? Does this deepen my trust in God or impede it?

SOCIAL JUSTICE

October has been designated as "Pro-Life" month. It is also the month that prepares Americans for local and national elections. Our Social Justice Corner will look at Church teaching on these issues through the lens of racial justice.

The injustice and harm racism causes are an attack on human life. The Church in the United States has spoken out consistently and forcefully against abortion, assisted suicide, euthanasia, the death penalty, and other forms of violence that threaten human life. It is not a secret that these attacks on human life have severely affected people of color, who are disproportionally affected by poverty, targeted for abortion, have less access to healthcare, have the greatest numbers on death row, and are most likely to feel pressure to end their lives when facing serious illness. As bishops, we unequivocally state that racism is a life issue. Accordingly, we will not cease to speak forcefully against and work toward ending racism. Racism directly places brother and sister against each other, violating the dignity inherent in each person.


