





THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



LK 18:1-8

Like Moses, we may grow weary of petitioning God in prayer. That is when we need the support of the community to come to our assistance. They help us remember that God is with us in all our struggles; God is our "shade" in the heat of conflict.

Paul is our companion who inspires us when we are weak. He reminds us that God's word is a training ground for the battles of life. Fully equipped, we are competent to do every good work. No matter how difficult the trials, we have a responsibility to share God's word. Whether convenient or inconvenient, we must never give up.

Jesus tells a parable about persistence in prayer. In the story, a poor widow suffered ill-treatment from her opponent. The judge who heard her case was hard-hearted, unconcerned with her rights or with God's justice. Although she demanded her due repeatedly, the judge refused to listen to her pleas. She did not lose heart, and eventually the case was settled in her favor. Jesus asks, if this corrupt judge hear the cries of the poor, would God refuse to answer those who called out with faith night and day?

For Reflection: Who comes to my aid when I am weak? How does my parish show a "preferential option for the poor"?

CHILD PROTECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments-Bullying Prevention Month: Relational bullying is unwarranted, persistent, unwelcome behavior in the form of criticism, isolation, or fabricated allegations that can damage relationships. Examples include social exclusion ("You can't be with us"), spreading rumors ("Did you hear ... ?"), and withholding friendship ("I won't be your friend if you..."). Though relational bullying can often seem ambiguous to outside observers and often garners less attention than physical bullying or verbal bullying, it should not be discounted simply as normal, adolescent behavior. In fact, several recent studies suggest relational bullying is more strongly related to emotional distress and teen depression than any other form of bullying. October has been designated as "Pro-Life" month. It is also the month that prepares Americans for local and national elections. Our Social Justice

Corner will look at Church teaching on these issues through the lens of racial justice.

"Racism can only end if we contend with the policies and institutional barriers that perpetuate and preserve the inequality – economic and social – that we still see all around us."

Open Wide Our Hearts USCCB

Racism can be individual, when persons fail to recognize certain groups as created in the image and likeness of God and equal in dignity, or it can be systemic, where practices or policies treat certain groups of people unjustly. One example of systemic racism is lack of access to the vote for some communities of color.

The Church teaches that all persons have both a legal right and a responsibility to have their voice heard in the public square to promote human dignity and the common good of society. As people of faith, we have the obligation to help shape the moral character of society by voting and other acts of public participation. We also must act to ensure that the right to vote is protected for all citizens. This has often been threatened for many minorities in the U.S. Today, too many barriers to the right to vote remain for minorities. In response, we are called to work to ensure that all are able to exercise their rights, as faithful citizens, to raise their voices in the public square.
