

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION MT 3:1-12



"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"

John the Baptist not only heralds the coming of the kingdom, but proclaims the same message that Jesus would soon preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" He tells us that we should prepare, with some degree of urgency, for the fullness of God's power and presence in our world by turning away from evil and turning toward God. This turnaround requires a radical and deeply internal change of direction in our lives. This internal conversion then expresses itself in external acts and works of penance.

With our hearts thus moved by God's grace, we bear good fruit-offering gestures of reconciliation, showing concern for the poor, and seeking to end injustice. During Advent, for example, we might seek to heal the alienation caused by a family conflict or offer forgiveness to someone who has hurt us. We could provide a meal or Christmas gift for someone less fortunate. We also might choose to fast or deny ourselves some comfort in order to more fully embrace the gift.

Repentance is a continuing task, an ongoing process of conversion. But with hope in God's mercy and trust in his grace, we can be ready for God's power and presence in our world and in our lives.
