Who are those guys carrying the cross in the entrance procession for the 6:00 p.m. and 8:30 a.m. Masses? They are none other than Paul Barko and Dave Jacquel, two parishioners in their fourth year of study and formation to become Permanent Deacons (it is a 5-year process).

Paul has been a member of the parish for close to twenty years and his wife Deb has been a member of Our Lady of Mercy all her life. He graduated from Cathedral Prep and Penn State Behrend. He married Deb thirty years ago and they reside in Harborcreek. They have two children Brittany and Andrew who graduated from Collegiate Academy and Harborcreek High School respectively. Both children have degrees from major universities and are doing well in their fields of Music Therapy and Finance. EXPERIENCE THE SACRAMENTS...



Jesus spent the greatest amount of his time healing, both spiritually and physically. It is said that we spend our time on those things which are most important to us. If this is true, then healing must have been a very important value to Jesus.

Our Parish Mission Statement reminds us that we are a community that lives the values of Jesus Christ. Our celebration is not just for the sick. The faith

community gathers with them to show their concern for the sick of our community, and to pray with and for the sick of the community.

The celebration of this sacrament is an opportunity for the deepening of the faith of our entire community by witnessing the faith and devotion of those being anointed. Through anointing, the sick are reminded that Christ and the Church are in communion with their suffering.

Our Parish Community will celebrate this powerful sacrament at all Masses on November 23 & 24

Who may celebrate this Sacrament? Those who are suffering any serious physical or mental illness; those who are suffering any chronic illness. those who are about to undergo surgery; the elderly who cannot get around as well as before.



Advent is a beautiful season to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. While not officially described as a penitential season (which distinguishes it from Lent), Advent is still a season for ongoing conversion, as we reflect on the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus and heed John the Baptist's call to repentance and conversion.

Communal celebrations of the Sacrament of Reconciliation remind us that continued conversion is a journey we make together as the Body of Christ.



THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

The Church has a long tradition of remembering those who have died to the love and mercy of God. Parishes have the custom of giving a place of honor to a book in which community members and visitors write the names of their beloved dead. We do this in a special way on the Feast of All Souls Day, and throughout November. The Book of Remembrance (or the Book of the Names of the Dead) was inspired by the ancient practice of recording the dates of the deaths of loved ones in a public record or registry of death. This practice provides the living with an opportunity for healing and consolation in the face of grief. The Book of the Names of the Dead will be displayed in the sanctuary from the solemnity of All Saints until the beginning of



Advent. It is left open for people to write the names of their deceased loved ones and for others to read the names, remember, and pray for the repose of their souls. Remembering all of these men and women who have gone before us, "marked with the sign of faith," helps us better understand and appreciate our faith in the Christ our risen Lord who conquers sin and death and brings new life to all.

- Providing financial and technical assistance to producers whenever possible.

Fair trade recognizes the dignity of work and ensures that workers are fairly compensated. It protects and honors the human dignity of each worker by respecting the right to work and helping to maintain livelihoods. 
