



Feast of St. Blaise

This Monday, February 3rd, is the Feast of St. Blaise. As is the custom we will bless throats Monday at the 8:30 Mass in the morning and at 5:00 p.m. in the afternoon.

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



MATTHEW 5:1-12

"Blessed are the poor in spirit."

Matthew's Sermon on the Mount could be called Jesus' "inaugural Address." Jesus goes up the mountain, sits down (as rabbis did when teaching), and begins to teach his disciples who gather round. At the end of the sermon, the people will be "astonished by this teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes". We, too, can sit down and ponder sections of this great teaching.

Jesus begins with beatitudes - statements about the blessedness of our lives. Blessed can mean "fortunate" and is commonly translated as "happy." It's a state of being we all seek, but it doesn't come from the things of this world: power, beauty, riches, etc. It comes from being in right relationship with God.

To be "poor in spirit" doesn't mean that we seek poverty. In Jesus' world, no one should live in poverty. Justice calls us to eliminate poverty! The late William Barclay in his commentary on Matthew says that one who is poor in spirit realizes that "things mean nothing...God means everything." Happy are those who put God first in their lives. What a challenging opening statement for us to ponder!

For Reflection: What do I usually count among my blessings? Is poverty of spirit at the top of the list? How can this kind of poverty become a gift in my life?



Human Trafficking

Feast of St. Josephine Bakhita February 8 is the feast day of St.

Josephine Bahkita and an annual day of prayer and awareness against human trafficking. Around the year 1877, St. Josephine was kidnapped as a child and sold into slavery in Sudan and then Italy. She was freed twelve years later, became a Canossian nun and spent her life comforting the poor and suffering, as well as telling her story of being enslaved. Human trafficking, the modern name for slavery, continues to occur today. During this month of St. Josephine's feast, take a moment to pray for an end to human trafficking and for comfort and strength for survivors.
