

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



MATTHEW 4:1-11

"If you are the Son of God..."

Matthew's account of Jesus' temptations clearly proclaims that Jesus could be tempted. Is he tempted to power? Is he tempted to vanity? Maybe he is just tempted to assuage his deep, physical hunger after a forty-day fast.

Turning stone to bread seems like far less a miracle than he will perform in feeding the multitudes from just five loaves and two fish (Mt. 14:14-21). But deep lure of the temptations goes beyond having Jesus selfishly perform a miracle for his own benefit. The crux of each temptation may be to manifest an unmistakable sign of Jesus' relationship to God.

"If you are the Son of God, then prove it." And to whom is he tempted to prove it, to the one who tempts him? Surely that is no temptation to Jesus. But what if the temptation were to prove it to himself?

Dining on the word of God will have to be its own proof. It is the only proof possible. This is the bread that will sustain him through the desert, all the way to the cross.

Reflection: How is God sustaining me when I am tempted?
