





THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION MATTHEW 21:1-22



I grew up in a small town Missouri where Catholics were a minority. I can remember serving at the Easter Vigil when I was about sixteen and being very worried that my friends might see me outside helping light the fire. Our parish church was on Main Street, popular for cruising on Saturday nights. I was afraid of ridicule for doing another of "those Catholic things." What did my fear keep me from that night?

We all have experiences fear in one form or another - fear of ridicule, rejection, physical harm, or even the unknown. Today we celebrate the Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. How many who gathered 2,000 years ago to celebrate his entry stayed with him through his Passion? The disciples would fear for their own lives, and Peter would deny him. The priests would conspire to kill him because they feared the power and authority of his teaching. Fearful of losing political power, Pilate would wash his hands of Jesus' death sentence.

As we gather today to shout, "Hosanna," we are called not only to welcome Our Lord with joy, but to shed our fears, take up our cross and share his Passion, so we might share in his resurrections.

Reflection: What fears take up the room in my life that should be reserved for joy?





Child Abuse Prevention Month

Reporting Suspected Child Abuse is Everyone's Responsibility:

It is every adult's moral responsibility to report suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2019 state report there were 5,102 substantiated reports of child abuse in Pennsylvania in 2018. 47.4% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse. To report suspected abuse of a minor, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). Visit https://www.eriercd.org/childprotection/ to learn how mandated reporters in the Erie diocese are required report suspected child abuse.


