

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



"Receive the Holy Spirit."



Walk across any college campus, and you will notice shortcuts forged across the lawn by hurried students and joggers. I wonder: Why didn't the architects design the most effective route from the beginning?

I wonder, in daily life, why do we not choose the better route? Why do we allow ourselves to be distracted from God's way? Why do we get mired in petty conflicts? Why do we not recognize Jesus' gift of peace?

When Jesus appeared to his fearful disciples, he proclaimed what had been accomplished through his death and resurrection: "shalom," perfect reconciliation with his Father for all the world, prosperity through fullness of life in God. The peace of Christ forges a path through every obstacle. It is not a short cut, nor is it the easiest route, but it is the most direct and lasting path to happiness.

Having proclaimed his peace, Jesus showed them his wounds. And breathing the Spirit on them, he said, "Forgive."

If we look at his wounds and feel the breath of his Spirit warming our faces, we will not take lightly the gift of peace. And we will forgive.

Are the paths we forge worth of his gift? Reflection: Does the path I am on lead to peace? Bishop J. Peter Sartain

SOCIAL JUSTICE

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought racial inequality out of the shadows. According to the CDC, Black Americans are dying of COVID-19 at a rate 3 times higher than White Americans. The CDC sites a number of reasons for this racial disparity. Black Americans live in more densely populated neighborhoods due to segregation which makes social isolation more challenging. They are disproportionately represented in front line jobs such as bus drivers, grocery store clerks and nursing assistants. They are under employed in jobs that allow for working from home. Black Americans have a higher amount of preexisting health conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure. According to the CDC, lack of grocery stores and hospitals in predominantly black neighborhoods is a primary contributing factor to these conditions. Further, systemic and historic discrimination in the health care system has resulted in wide spread mistrust of the medical system by blacks. Black and Latino Americans are also disproportionately harmed by the economic downturn resulting from COVID-19. According to government statistics, the unemployment rate for whites in April soared to just above 14%, for blacks it was over 16% and for Latinos it reached nearly 19%. Because Latinos and blacks were the last to benefit from the economic gains of the past decade, they are disproportionately represented in entry level jobs among the lowest paid workers. Because of this, they lack the savings needed to weather an economic storm.

On Thursday evening, Bishop Persico, the shepherd of the Diocese of Erie, hosted a Town Hall meeting in which he shared



his plan for the gradual reopening of public Masses within the Diocese. In this meeting, the Bishop shared not only his joy about resuming public Mass, but also his fears and concerns.

And so, with both happiness and caution, and in accord with the protocols given by the Bishop, Our Lady of Mercy will resume daily Mass on Monday, June 1 at 8:30 a.m. (in the primary worship space). Sunday Masses will resume the weekend of June 6/7. Live-streamed Mass on Sunday will remain in place.

The parish staff will be diligently and prudently working in the next few weeks to be properly ready for our homecoming. We are overjoyed to be able to gather to worship in person, but Mass will be very different than what we are accustomed to. We pray for patience, support, and kindness toward each other as we enter this uncharted phase as one spiritual family.


