

# THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



JOHN 3:16-18

...that the world might be saved through him. Today's passage is perhaps the best-loved and most quotes text in the Bible. "John 3:16" is like a code for the good news. It summarizes the entire Bible: faith in the Son sent by a loving God leads to eternal life. God's intentions are wholly directed to our good.

But what about verse 18? It brings us up short with a warning that anyone who does not believe in the only Son of God "has already been condemned."

I am reminded of the story of a sea captain who argued with a signal from a lowly seaman's distant light to change course. "I'm the captain, you change course." "I'm in a lighthouse, sir!" was the reply that ended the argument.

In John's Gospel, faith in the Son of God is the signal we must obey. John 3:16 is like a weather report for fair skies and smooth seas. But John 3:18 is a warning that if we do not believe in Jesus and give ourselves to him, we will crash on the rocks. With God, the choice is to accept or reject his offer of salvation. The course is ours to change or not.

Reflection: How is the Gospel challenging me this week to make decisions based on my faith in Jesus Christ?


#### **Grief Support**

### **SOCIAL JUSTICE**

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought racial inequality out of the shadows. According to the CDC, Black Americans are dying of COVID-19 at a rate 3 times higher than White Americans. The CDC sites a number of reasons for this racial disparity. Black Americans live in more densely populated neighborhoods due to segregation which makes social isolation more challenging. They are disproportionately represented in front line jobs such as bus drivers, grocery store clerks and nursing assistants. They are under employed in jobs that allow for working from home. Black Americans have a higher amount of preexisting health conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure. According to the CDC, lack of grocery stores and hospitals in predominantly black neighborhoods is a primary contributing factor to these conditions. Further, systemic and historic discrimination in the health care system has resulted in wide spread mistrust of the medical system by blacks. Black and Latino Americans are also disproportionately harmed by the economic downturn resulting from COVID-19. According to government statistics, the unemployment rate for whites in April soared to just above 14%, for blacks it was over 16% and for Latinos it reached nearly 19%. Because Latinos and blacks were the last to benefit from the economic gains of the past decade, they are disproportionately represented in entry level jobs among the lowest paid workers. Because of this, they lack the savings needed to weather an economic storm.

# Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments



#### Listen to your children

This summer, when your children are out of school and on different schedules, meeting new people and going to new places, make sure that you talk to them often about their experiences and the people they've met. Listen carefully to your children. If possible, observe and get to know the other children and adults who are part of your children's summertime fun. Above all, communicate your safety concerns to your children. Make sure they know that they can come to you with any concerns they may have about the people they interact with. And if you hear of or observe behaviors that may be inappropriate, make sure to communicate your feelings to people who are in a position to intervene. On May 21, Bishop Lawrence T. Persico, Bishop of Erie, released a significant series of protocols regarding the return to public worship. Bishop Persico emphasized that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day Masses remains in effect. The elderly and people with vulnerabilities are asked to continue participating via livestream rather than attending Mass in person. The Bishop also encourages those who are not yet comfortable with being in public to continue worshiping from home. Bishop Persico will suspend Mass again in any county that Governor Wolf returns to the 'red phase'.

# Below are the protocols and guidelines pertinent to Our Lady of Mercy's resumption of public Masses:

- 1. Beginning Monday, June 1, 2020, Our Lady of Mercy will resume our regular Mass schedule.
- Monday through Friday − 8:30 a.m.
- •Saturday 6:00 p.m. (no 8:30 a.m. Mass on Saturday)
- •Sunday 8:30 a.m. & 11:00 a.m.
- 2. All public celebrations of Mass will take place in the primary worship space.
- 3. For those not attending Mass in person, we will continue to live-stream Sunday Mass at 11:00 a.m. on Facebook and YouTube.
- 4. Please understand that no one is required to attend Mass if they are not comfortable or if it is unsafe for them to do so. If you are in high-risk categories, not feeling well, or uncomfortable, please stay home and continue worshipping via live-stream.
- 5. The maximum number of participants is 1/3 of the building occupancy. Only every third pew will be available for seating.
- 6. Spiritual Communion continues to be strongly encouraged.
- 7. Sanitize your hands when arriving and as needed while you at the church. Please make an effort to bring your own sanitizer.
- 8. A face mask which covers the nose and mouth must be properly worn at all times. Please have it on when exiting your vehicle.
- 9. Entrances and exits will be propped open; avoid touching high-contact areas such as door handles, hand rails, and push plates.
- 10. When possible, use the restroom before coming to church to avoid gatherings in and near the restrooms.
- 11. Upon arriving for Mass, go directly to an open pew and file into the middle so no one has to crawl over you. Please do not congregate in the Gathering Space.
- 12. Six feet of social distancing between different households must always be observed.
- Members of the same household may sit together.
- Multiple households may share a pew, provided there is proper social distancing.
- 13. When exiting, please do so in an orderly fashion. We will dismiss row by row, beginning from the back of the Worship Space. Maintain social distancing and return directly to your vehicle, continuing to wear your face mask. Please do not congregate in the gathering space.

- 14. Printed bulletins will be on tables if you would like one; digital copies are always available on our website.
- 15. The church and all liturgical items will be sanitized between Masses.
- 16. The following liturgical actions remain suspended:
- •greeting of parishioners before and after Mass
- placing of holy water in fonts
- exchange of the sign of peace
- distribution of the Precious Blood
- 17. There will be no communal singing of hymns, psalms, or Mass parts. Singing expels significantly more respiratory particles than speaking. At some Masses, there will be musical accompaniment and a soloist may sing. If attending Mass in person, you are asked to join your hearts silently and prayerfully to the music.
- 18. There will be no collection or presentation of the gifts. Baskets will be placed near the church doors where you may leave your offering.
- 19. The universal posture for the Eucharistic Prayer will be standing. Please do not use the kneelers.
- 20. Please do not hold hands during the Lord's Prayer (Our Father). You are invited to maintain the open hands "orans" position.
- 21. Communion in the hand is strongly recommended by the Bishop.
- 22. Sanitize your hands and continue to wear your face mask before entering the Communion line.
- 23. When approaching to receive Communion, approach in a single-file line, one row at a time.
- 24. Maintain social distance by standing on the marked lines in the aisles.
- 25. If you are not receiving Communion, still proceed through the communion line without receiving. This will help facilitate the flow of the procession.
- 26. When receiving Communion, take the Host in one hand, step to the side, pull down your mask with the other hand and consume the Host. Immediately replace your mask and return to your seat.
- 27. As we resume celebrating public Mass and the Coronavirus pandemic continues to evolve, our practices and protocols may change. Please be patient and flexible.
