



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

MATTHEW 10:37-42

"Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."



"Who am I?" Answering that question is often the goal of self-examination in contemporary modern cultures. Self-knowledge is sometimes depicted as a journey of discovery. The thinking appears to be that when we finally discover ourselves we will be better workers, more perceptive parents, more loving spouses, and dearer friends to others. Sometimes, though, such self-searching goes to the extreme of self-protection at the expense of service to others.

The gospel, however, offers us a different understanding of self-discovery. Jesus says that we must lose our lives for his sake before we will actually find our lives. It sounds like a complete contradiction, but it's the wisdom that our age needs to hear. A healthy sense of self cannot be based on success with the latest methods for self-help, or the opinion of others, but must be rooted in God's loving and creative call in our lives.

All efforts to protect the "self" from harm may in fact do harm to the very self that finds its home in Christ. We are not asked to neglect the self, but to find the true meaning of one's life in the self-giving that Jesus models for us.

Reflection: Who am I? Where will I search for the answer? Am I willing to lose any false sense of myself?

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Bread For the World, a Christian advocacy group for the elimination of global hunger, has released its annual report on global nutrition. For the full report and recommendations to

combat hunger, go to hungerreport.org/2020/ The 2020 Hunger Report offers a snapshot of nutrition concerns around the world. Here are some highlights.

- •Around the world, currently, there are 822 million people undernourished because of insufficient calories, more than 2 billion people undernourished because of vitamin and mineral (micronutrient) deficiencies, and another 2 billion overweight or obese. This means that approximately $1/3^{rd}$ of the global population suffers from at least one of these forms of malnutrition. By 2030, if current trends continue, ½ of the world's population will suffer from one or more of these forms of malnutrition.
- •In the United States, 11.1% of the population experienced food insecurity in the past year. A food insecure household is one in which 1 or more members were deprived of adequate calories or nutrition because of poverty or related limitations.
- •Roughly 1 in 3 people globally were chronically malnourished in the 1960s. Because of the efforts by international and national organizations, that rate has been dramatically reduced today to

- approximately 1 in 10. But since 2015, the global malnutrition rate has been climbing.
- •Currently, 1 in 5 children under the age of 5 years is stunted due to chronic malnutrition. Lack of adequate nutrients in the first 2 years of life results in lifelong physical and cognitive disabilities. The
- •United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) estimates that, globally, two out of three children do not consume the minimum recommended diverse diet for healthy growth and development.
- •Malnutrition has been and remains the world's leading cause of poor health.
- •Today, 2/3rds of the world's over weight and obese people live in low and middle income countries. Hunger related poverty prompts people to search out high calorie food with little nutritional value because such food is inexpensive. Obesity is a leading factor in many chronic diseases including diabetes and hypertension. The combination of obesity and micro nutrition insufficiency puts people at high risk for life threatening illnesses such as stroke and cancer.
- •Ecological changes will be the leading cause of growing hunger and malnutrition in the coming decade. We are not producing food sustainably. For example, many of the agricultural methods used today are a leading cause of ecosystem destruction. Production processes often rob crops of their nutrients, and this only gets worse over time since the ecosystem becomes depleted and cannot regenerate.
