



THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION



MATTHEW 13:1-23

A sower went out to sow.

Let's put ourselves in this story. We've heard of this man Jesus from Nazareth, how he's healed people, driven out demons, cleansed lepers, made the lame to walk, the blind to see. Today we're here to be part of the crowd.

He sat in a boat and began to speak: "A sower went out to sow." AS I listened to his words I was puzzled. I know there's more here than an actual story he told, but what does it mean? Who is this sower who can be so extravagant?

I've seen sowers planting and noticed how careful they are to sow only where the seed will sprout. They cant afford to sow where little will grow. After all, they will reap a share of the harvest from the landowner, and they have families to feed. The greater the harvest, the greater the yield to cover those years when the harvest is poor.

Who then is this sower who can afford to sow his seed not only in rich soil but also in places where seed has a hard time growing: on path, on rocky ground, among thorns? What kind of farmer can expect to reap such a bountiful harvest?

Reflection: When has a normal everyday action become an example of extravagance in my life? How can my daily routine become an opportunity for fruitfulness?

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Plastic waste has become a serious threat to the life of our oceans. The COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically increased the plastic problem. We entered the pandemic with troubling statistics about plastic waste.

- •Every day around 8 million pieces of plastic makes their way into our oceans.
- •The world produces 381 million tons in plastic waste yearly this is set to double by 2034.
- $\bullet 50\%$ of this is single-use plastic & only 9% has ever been recycled.
- •The Great Pacific Garbage Patch is around 1.6 million square kilometers bigger than Texas.
- More than 1 million seabirds and 100,000 marine animals die from plastic pollution every year.
- •100% of baby sea turtles have plastic in their stomachs.
- •1 in 3 fish caught for human consumption contains plastic.
- •There is now 5.25 trillion macro and micro pieces of plastic in our ocean & 46,000 pieces in every square mile of ocean, weighing up to 269,000 tons.
- Plastic microbeads are estimated to be one million times more toxic than the seawater around it.
- •88% of the sea's surface is polluted by plastic waste.
- Between 8 to 14 million tons enters our ocean every year.
- •The US contributes 38 million tons of plastic every year.
- Plastic packaging is the biggest culprit, resulting in 80

million tons of waste yearly from the US alone.

- More than 1 million plastic bags end up in the trash every minute.
- •The world uses over 500 billion plastic bags a year that's 150 for each person on Earth.

Although it is too early to know the extent to which plastic waste has increased during the first 6 months of 2020, it is clear that the pandemic is adding plastic waste to the environment at an alarming rate.

The closure of restaurants to on-site dining has forced them to shift to take out meals packaged in one-time use plastic containers. To minimize virus transmission, people have turned to on-line shopping for much of their needs. This has meant an increase in plastic packaging. Recent efforts to move customers away from plastic bags and other one-time use containers has been stalled. Many businesses no longer permit reusable containers in their stores for fear of COVID contamination. And, of course. the vital personal protective equipment essential to the safety of health care and other front line workers, has added an enormous amount of gloves, masks and disposable gowns to the mountain of plastic refuge moving to municipal dumps and into our oceans. At the same time our use of plastics is increasing so significantly, a large number of recycling programs are being suspended. Fear for the safety of workers, cheaper oil which makes virgin plastic less expensive than ever to produce, and more lighter weight plastics which are less profitable to recycle is all part of the recycling decline. If we care about the health of our oceans, we must work to reverse this trend of rapidly increasing plastic waste in our landfills and oceans.


