

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION MATTHEW 13:24-43



"Do you want us to go and pull them up?"
Have you ever tended to a flower or vegetable garden? With practice you become familiar with the shape and color of most plants. But often you cannot be sure which are good plants and which are weeds until they grow a bit.

The parable of the grain and weeds isn't really a gardening lesson. It is a lesson about who should judge, and a reminder that we can grow and change. Jesus is telling us that we must resist our human tendency to judge others and "uproot" the weeds because we don't know which is wheat and which is weed. The Master will make that judgement at harvest time.

This parable also reminds us that each of us can change and grow, and each of us is important to God. Until the judgment at harvest time, we are a work in process, a growing plant. An experienced gardener can certainly identify the wheat and the weeds long before harvest and would willingly uproot a few wheat plants to get rid of the weeds, but God is not willing to lose a single good plant.

Unlike wheat or weeds, God has given us the possibility to choose, and to change as we grow, to produce good fruit.

Reflection: What personal choices have I made that have produced growth? When have my judgements prevented me from seeing growth in others?


Ink Jet Fundraiser

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Plastic waste has become a serious threat to the life of our oceans. The COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically increased the plastic problem. We entered the pandemic with troubling statistics about plastic waste.

- Every day around 8 million pieces of plastic makes their way into our oceans.
- •The world produces 381 million tons in plastic waste yearly this is set to double by 2034.
- •50% of this is single-use plastic & only 9% has ever been recycled.
- •The Great Pacific Garbage Patch is around 1.6 million square kilometers bigger than Texas.
- More than 1 million seabirds and 100,000 marine animals die from plastic pollution every year.
- •100% of baby sea turtles have plastic in their stomachs.
- •1 in 3 fish caught for human consumption contains plastic.
- •There is now 5.25 trillion macro and micro pieces of plastic in our ocean & 46,000 pieces in every square mile of ocean, weighing up to 269,000 tons.
- Plastic microbeads are estimated to be one million times more toxic than the seawater around it.
- •88% of the sea's surface is polluted by plastic waste.
- Between 8 to 14 million tons enters our ocean every year.
- •The US contributes 38 million tons of plastic every year.
- Plastic packaging is the biggest culprit, resulting in 80 million tons of waste yearly from the US alone.

- More than 1 million plastic bags end up in the trash every minute.
- •The world uses over 500 billion plastic bags a year that's 150 for each person on Earth.

Although it is too early to know the extent to which plastic waste has increased during the first 6 months of 2020, it is clear that the pandemic is adding plastic waste to the environment at an alarming rate.

The closure of restaurants to on-site dining has forced them to shift to take out meals packaged in one-time use plastic containers. To minimize virus transmission, people have turned to on-line shopping for much of their needs. This has meant an increase in plastic packaging. Recent efforts to move customers away from plastic bags and other one-time use containers has been stalled. Many businesses no longer permit reusable containers in their stores for fear of COVID contamination. And, of course, the vital personal protective equipment essential to the safety of health care and other front line workers, has added an enormous amount of gloves, masks and disposable gowns to the mountain of plastic refuge moving to municipal dumps and into our oceans. At the same time our use of plastics is increasing so significantly, a large number of recycling programs are being suspended. Fear for the safety of workers, cheaper oil which makes virgin plastic less expensive than ever to produce, and more lighter weight plastics which are less profitable to recycle is all part of the recycling decline. If we care about the health of our oceans, we must work to reverse this trend of rapidly increasing plastic waste in our landfills and oceans.
