



Due to COVID, we will have to offer faith formation remotely **EDUCATION** this year. We need help to





THIS SUNDAY'S **REFLECTION**



MATTHEW 16:13-20

"Who do you say that I am?"

How do we come to know who we are?

Our parents, teachers, relatives, and friends provide guidelines/rules for proper acceptable behavior that reflects the love of God. They help us to know God, to discern and develop the talents God has given us. Through their words of affirmation, we are encouraged to use these guidelines and talents as a committed teacher, a caring parent, a faithful friend, a loving spouse, a dedicated employee, a skilled laborer.

In times of quiet we reflect on what kind of person we are, in what ways we are faithful to our God, to our calling. We acknowledge how we have failed to be true to our calling, how we have failed to heed the laws of God.

Who do I say that Jesus is? Jesus is my brother, my friend, my savior, my Lord. Many years ago I become aware that being a Christian was more than just being baptized and following the faith of my parents. I had to accept it for myself. Many others prepared me for that awareness by their words and actions. But one day I accepted it for myself. I became aware that I was indeed a child of God.

Reflection: Who is Jesus for me at this time in my life? Who am I for Jesus?

Social Justice

Two weeks ago, Bishop Persico joined religious leaders from the Erie area to pray and work for racial justice and healing in our community and country. He said, "The failure to act to end systemic racism, which is often animated in our laws, policies, and structures, hurts those who are victimized and denies all of us the opportunity to benefit from the gift of diversity." Calling people to wake up, stand up and speak up, Bishop Persico told participants, "This is how we love our neighbor as ourselves." Bishop Persico challenged all Catholics of our diocese to be part of the process of racial healing.

In response to the call of our Bishop, Our Lady of Mercy will hold an 8-week study entitled "Faith and Racial Healing" this fall. Through prayer, group discussion, book reflections and study, participants will learn about our history of racism and reflect on this history in light of the Gospel and teachings of the Church.

Because of COVID, the sessions will be held via Zoom. The group will gather semi-monthly on Tuesday evenings beginning on Sept. 20. In addition, the study will begin with a remote retreat and will incorporate a cultural experience later in the fall.

Three books will guide our study with an approximate cost of \$40. We can order the books for participants or people can search the web for copies on their own. No one should let the cost of books prevent them from participating. We can cover the cost of the books for anyone who requests.
