



# THIS SUNDAY'S





The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.



Even in biblical times, it seems, people made choices by asking, "What's in it for me?" Money and profit "were in it" for the vine growers. So intent were they on profits that they made stupid choices. Clearly they chose to serve the wrong master.

Each of us will choose to serve some master in life. Some people give all their attention to their job or career. Others become slaves to possessions. It is common for people to be so concerned about others' opinions that they become enslaved by what others think of them.

While serving these "masters" may bring a temporary fix to our human longings, it wont bear lasting fruit or save us. The allegorical story in today's gospel tells us to recognize and choose the right master.

One way to do this is to bring our deepest needs to God in honest prayer. Then relax and leave the burden with God. Gradually God will show us that we don't need the masters of busyness, greed, or low self -esteem. With attention and commitment to regular prayer, we will recognize that the master who wants to fulfill our deepest longings has been waiting quietly within us all along.

Reflection: What are the building blocks in my life? What supports have I relied on and can I continue to rely on them? How can I make sure Jesus is the cornerstone?



# Social Justice Faithful Citizenship

An important election confronts us in November. As individuals, we must decide how we will cast our votes. Does our faith and our Church have anything to say about those choices? The answer is "yes!" and the U.S. Bishops have created a document to help us. No, it does not tell us for whom we should vote, but it does guide us through what our faith says about this moral choice. The document is called Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility and it is available at that link on the website of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. The guide answers four questions and includes a summary of policy positions on many major issues of the day. It was written in 2015 with a new introductory letter added in 2019. The letter includes these words from Pope Francis, "The call to holiness requires a firm and passionate defense of the innocent unborn. Equally sacred are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection." A summary of the four questions follows.

Why does the Church teach about issues affecting public policy? "Because we are people of both faith and reason, it is appropriate and necessary for us to bring this essential truth about human life and dignity to the public square."

Who in the Church should participate in political life? "In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation."

# How Does the Church Help the Catholic Faithful to Speak About Political and Social Questions?

"The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience.....conscience always requires serious attempts to make sound moral judgments based on the truths of our faith." They further state, "The Church's teaching is clear that a good end does not justify an immoral means."

What does the Church say about Catholic Social Teaching in the Public Square?

The bishops use four principles to provide a moral framework for decisions in public life. The dignity of the human person, subsidiarity, the common good, and solidarity. Each of these principles are rich concepts that cannot be fully developed in this small space. I encourage you to take a few moments and skim this document, form your conscience and cast your vote to respect the dignity of every human being and the common good of all!
