# THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION

#### **MATTHEW 22:1-14**

"My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?"



Is there something wrong with this ruler? He can't get anyone on the wedding list to come to his son's wedding feast so he sends for the poor and the outcasts of the realm. Then, when they show up without wearing formal attire, they are sent to the gallows

I like the parable more when I think of my mother. I remember how gracious my mother always was when, as a child, I would ask for one of my friends to join us at the table. I also remember her irrepressible look of horror if my friend's hands revealed how deep in the flower garden we had been digging before the call to dinner came. The welcome at our meal was real. Washing was not an option.

God is the most gracious of hosts, but the feast to which we are called can be disrespected both by not showing up, or by displaying indifference at the feast itself. Matthew seems to say that while the invitation is enough to make us welcome, our response to the welcome cannot be a thoughtless, lackadaisical acceptance. If we are grateful guests our gratitude will be evident.

Reflection: How am I presenting myself to God for service each day? What thought do I put into my preparations for daily service to God and to the people of God?

# **Social Justice**

## Faithful Citizenship

An important election confronts us in November. As individuals, we must

decide how we will cast our votes. Does our faith and our Church have anything to say about those choices? The answer is "yes!" and the U. S. Bishops have created a document to help us. No, it does not tell us for whom we should vote, but it does guide us through what our faith says about this moral choice. The document is called Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to <u>Political Responsibility</u> and it is available at that link on the website of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. The guide answers four questions and includes a summary of policy positions on many major issues of the day. It was written in 2015 with a new introductory letter added in 2019. The letter includes these words from Pope Francis, "The call to holiness requires a firm and passionate defense of the innocent unborn. Equally sacred are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection."

A summary of the four questions follows.

Why does the Church teach about issues affecting public policy? "Because we are people of both faith and reason, it is appropriate and necessary for us to bring this essential truth about human life and dignity to the public square."

Who in the Church should participate in political life? "In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation."

How Does the Church Help the Catholic Faithful to Speak About Political and Social Questions?

"The Church equips its members to address political and social questions by helping them to develop a well-formed conscience.....conscience always requires serious attempts to make sound moral judgments based on the truths of our faith." They further state, "The Church's teaching is clear that a good end does not justify an immoral means."

What does the Church say about Catholic Social Teaching in the Public Square?

The bishops use four principles to provide a moral framework for decisions in public life. The dignity of the human person, subsidiarity, the common good, and solidarity. Each of these principles are rich concepts that cannot be fully developed in this small space. I encourage you to take a few moments and skim this document, form your conscience and cast your vote to respect the dignity of every human being and the common good of all!

#### **Bullying Prevention Month**

Relational bullying is unwarranted, persistent, unwelcome behavior in the form of criticism, isolation, or fabricated allegations that can damage relationships. Examples include social exclusion ("You can't be with us"), spreading rumors ("Did you hear...?"), and withholding friendship ("I won't be your friend if you..."). Though relational bullying can often seem ambiguous to outside observers and often garners less attention than physical bullying or verbal bullying, it should not be discounted simply as normal, adolescent behavior. In fact, several recent studies suggest relational bullying is more strongly related to emotional distress and teen depression than any other form of bullying.
