

THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION **MATTHEW 22:15-21** "Repay...to God what



belongs to God."

How in the world could we possibly obey the command that Jesus uttered when responding to a question about tax payment? The repayment to "Caesar" would be easy enough. It would require only an accurate accounting of our financial assets and earnings, and then paying the necessary portion to the state.

But repaying to God what belongs to God? It's overwhelming.

Every breath we take, every accomplishment, every idea and discovery - it all belongs to God. Repayment in full is not possible through our own efforts, but as we surrender more and more to our Creator, we may find that the impossible becomes possible. That image of God in which we were created becomes more apparent, and it begins to shape our wills and imaginations.

We hear Jesus' words to the Pharisees and Herodians and we begin to realize that it's all about surrender. Legalism can be transformed into loving obedience, and greed into generosity. Through God's grace we in fact become aware that our belongings themselves cannot begin to rival belonging to God

Social Justice



Fr. Frank DiSiano, CSP who preached the Mission at Our Lady of Mercy commented

one evening that on a walk Harborcreek he noticed many yard signs and wondered if the neighbors with different political signs talked with each other. No matter your source for news, you see daily reports of rancor and even violence in our streets as we approach Election Day. Disagreements on social media are becoming more and more nasty, revealing deep hostility towards those with whom we disagree.

What does it mean to love our neighbors in the midst of such a divisive climate? Catholics are called to bring the best of ourselves and our faith to the public square—and yet today, many shy away from such involvement because our national and local conversations are filled with anger and harsh language, often directed at peoples themselves. As Catholics, we must model a better way. We invite you to model love for neighbor by pledging to *Civilize It* and committing to civility, clarity, and compassion this election year.

- **Civility**: Recognize the human dignity of those with whom you disagree, treat others with respect, and rise above attacks when directed at me.
- Clarity: Root your political viewpoints in the Gospel and a well formed conscience, which involves prayer, conversation, study and listening. Stand up for your convictions and speak out when you witness language that disparages others' dignity, while also listening and seeking to understand others' experiences.
- **Compassion:** Encounter others with a tone and posture which affirms that you honor the dignity of others and invites others to do the same. Presume others' best intentions and listen to their stories with empathy. Strive to understand before seeking to be understood.

Civilize It: Dignity Beyond the Debate is a **non-partisan** call to focus on the dignity of all people, even those with whom we disagree, and to put faith in action. Make room in your heart for those with whom you disagree and pledge dignity beyond the debate today at <u>CivilizeIt.org</u>!
