# THIS SUNDAY'S REFLECTION





"You shall love...."



What a contrast there is between "thou shalt not" and the command to love! The injunctions of the Ten Commandments enable a society to live in relative peace and safety, free from the threat of robbery, murder, and adultery, but Jesus, throughout his ministry, by his actions and his teachings, makes it clear that they represent the minimum in human behavior. A new paradigm has replaced the old. Jesus' followers are to be known by their love.

Throughout the Christian Scriptures the emphasis on our obligation to love is unambiguous. To love God, to love our neighbor, and yes, to love ourselves, is the core of the Old Testament covenant and the call of Jesus. Compassion, generosity, forgiveness are the nature of this love.

Love is not simply and emotion, it is action. Love is walking the extra mile, giving from our poverty, listening to the tedious, caring for the helpless, welcoming the stranger. Love calls us to live as if the Kingdom of God were already here and, by doing so, to make it a reality. Love demands us to go beyond our basic instinct of self-preservation to serve the needs of others.

# **Social Justice**

Fr. Frank DiSiano, CSP who preached the Mission at Our Lady of Mercy commented one evening that on a walk Harborcreek he noticed many yard signs and wondered if the neighbors with different political signs talked with each other. No matter your source for news, you see daily reports of rancor and even violence in our streets as we approach Election Day. Disagreements on social media are becoming more and more nasty, revealing deep hostility towards those with whom we disagree.

What does it mean to love our neighbors in the midst of such a divisive climate? Catholics are called to bring the best of ourselves and our faith to the public square—and yet today, many shy away from such involvement because our national and local conversations are filled with anger and harsh language, often directed at peoples themselves. As Catholics, we must model a better way. We invite you to model love for neighbor by pledging to *Civilize It* and committing to civility, clarity, and compassion this election year.

Civility: Recognize the human dignity of those with whom you disagree, treat others with respect, and rise above attacks when directed at me.

Clarity: Root your political viewpoints in the Gospel and a well formed conscience, which involves prayer, conversation, study and listening. Stand up for your convictions and speak out when you witness language that disparages others' dignity, while also listening and seeking to understand others' experiences.

Compassion: Encounter others with a tone and posture which affirms that you honor the dignity of others and invites others to do the same. Presume others' best intentions and listen to their stories with empathy. Strive to understand before seeking to be understood.

Civilize It: Dignity Beyond the Debate is a non-partisan call to focus on the dignity of all people, even those with whom we disagree, and to put faith in action.
